Ordinances & Resolutions for Consideration

1. Ordinance No. 2024-055

Patron Cmbr. Robertson

Key Points:

- To designate the corner of 1601 Littlepage Street and Mechanicsville Turnpike in honor of Reverend Shady Clark, Jr. (6th District)
- Reverend Shady Clark, Jr. was a well-known educator, religious leader and community activist.

- Frank J. Wilkins, Sr. was a well-known religious leader and community activist.

5. Resolution No. 2024-R011

Key Points:

- To adopt Richmond Connects, Strategic Plan: A Multimodal Plan for Improving Transportation Equity in Richmond as the official comprehensive transportation plan for the City of Richmond in accordance with Res. No. 2019-R065, adopted Dec. 9, 2019, and Res. No. 2021-R032, adopted Jun. 14, 2021.
- The plan reflects a strategic plan developed in the Office of Transportation Equity to outline high priority projects and strategies to improve transportation equity.
- The prioritizes pedestrian safety, emphasizing equity, while outlining future projects that the city will seek funding to complete. High priority projects



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are outlined for infrastructure development along with policy changes to address programmatic needs to improve equity.

6. Ordinance No. 2024-056

Key Points:

- To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept a donation from The Valentine Museum of a two-part sculpture to be installed in front of the property known as 1015 East Clay Street, along with maintenance services thereto, valued in the total amount of approximately \$37,500.00 for the purpose of the aesthetic enhancement of the 1000 block of East Clay Street. (6th District)
- The sculpture celebrates the 100th anniversary of the Valentine Museum and has been approved for installation by the City's Public Art Commission.

7. Ordinance No. 2024-075

Key Points:

- To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a License Agreement between the Capital Region Land Conservancy, Inc., as licensor, and the City of Richmond, as licensee, for the purpose of granting the City of Richmond access to the portion of the Richmond Slave Trail located on the property known as 1401 Brander Street in the city of Richmond to make certain improvements. (6th District)
- The City needs to make the repairs to the trail on its north bank. The needed repairs are not specified in the Administration's O&R.
