PURPOSE: To amend the FY2016 General Fund Budget (Ord. 2015-73-84) by transferring funds ear marked in Non Departmental specifically for the 2% salary increase to multiple City departments.

REASON: The FY2016 adopted budget included funds for a 2% salary increase for general employees (excluding Constitutionals Offices). Funding in the amount of \$2,150,000 was included in Non-Departmental for this purpose. This paper seeks to transfer funds earmarked for the 2% salary increase to respective departments.

RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends adoption of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: As part of the "Well-managed Government" strategy, the Administration is requesting amendments to more closely align agency budgets with their projected expenditures. In May of 2015, City Council approved a budget that included funds in Non-Departmental for a 2% salary increase for all general fund employees. Constitutional Officers and their employees were excluded from the analysis as their pay increase was to be determined by the State (this will be addressed in a future O&R). Employees began receiving their 2% increase starting with the last check in July.

Currently, agencies are projected to be over budget in personnel as a result of the payout of the 2% salary increase and the funds not being present within departments' budget to cover the costs. This technical amendment seeks to address this issue.
