To adopt a newly updated Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas Map delineating Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas in the City of Richmond as part of compliance with the City's Chesapeake Bay Act program, set forth in Ch. 14, Art. IV of the Richmond City Code.

REASON: Pursuant to Section 14-202 of the Richmond City Code and 9VAC25-830-60 of the Virginia Administrative Code, the City must delineate the boundaries of designated Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas (the "Areas") on a map layer in the city's geographical information system, which map City Council may amend when updated information from evaluations of the Areas calls for adjustments to their boundaries. Based on new development and stream determinations approved by the Department of Environmental Quality, there is new information that needs updating on the map.

BACKGROUND: Development and periodic updating of the City's Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas map is one of several mandatory elements of the City's Chesapeake Bay preservation program, set forth in Ch. 14, Art. IV of the Richmond City Code and authorized by Virginia's Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act, Va. Code § 62.1-44.15:67, et seq. (the "Act"). The program functions to protect and improve the water quality of the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries by minimizing the effects of land use and development on those waters. Accurate depiction of the Areas serves this function by ensuring that land within the City having an intrinsic

water quality value is subject to development restrictions that limit infiltration of harmful solids into tributaries of the Chesapeake Bay.
