ORD. 1. 2015-179-19 To rezone the property known as 2816 West Broad Street from the B-3 General Business District to the B-7 Mixed-Use Business District.

To repeal City Code § 114-910.5, concerning the Brookland Park Boulevard/North Avenue parking overlay district PO-5, to remove the description of the district; to designate the PE-7 Brookland Park

Boulevard/North Avenue Parking Exempt Overlay District; and to rezone certain properties along Brookland Park Boulevard between Montrose Avenue and Woodrow Avenue and along North Avenue between Essex Street and Crawford Street to the UB Urban Business District.
