As the owners of the residence at 4656 Arrowhead Road, which is immediately opposite the property under review, we enthusiastically support both the important contributions of Barbara Slatcher to the stewardship and preservation of Richmond-area fauna, and the continuation of Barbara's efforts to that end at the property known as 4647 Arrowhead Road.

In the four years that we have lived opposite Barbara, we have found her and her husband Wayne to be both model neighbors and conscientious property owners.
