**PURPOSE:** This O&R request is to amend Ordinance No. 2023-181 (see Attachment A1) adopted on June 26, 2023, regarding the name change of the award recipient for the preservation of multifamily dwellings and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to develop and execute all documents necessary to do so based on proposed changes to one of the award recipients. See the **Amended Attachment A1** for the proposed amended award recipient name change.

Originally, the development was slated to be owned and managed by Lafayette Gardens, LLC which received an allocation of 9% Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) in September 2022. After several months of structuring the development capital stack and showcasing a large deficit, BHC returned the original allocation of 9% credits and secured 4% LIHTC Tax Exempt Bond.

However, for the development to utilize acquisition credits, BHC is preparing to sell the development currently owned by Lafayette Gardens, LLC to Ruffin Apartments, LLC at the time of construction closing, which is slated for November 2024.

**BACKGROUND:** On June 26, 2023, City Council reviewed and approved the use of the FY24 Federal Entitlement Funds. One of the federally funded HOME awards was given to Lafayette Gardens, which is the project sponsor. An award to the sponsor, in this case, is problematic due to them having received a 4% LIHTC Tax Exempt Bond based upon the HOME regulations. The award should have been made in the name of the project owner, which is Ruffin Apartments, LLC, thus requiring the name change.
