Interim Deputy City Clerk Lisa Braxton informed Council that a budget public hearing will be held only for Ords. 2018-057, 2018-058, 2018-059, 2018-060, 2018-071, 2018-080, 2018-081, 2018-139, 2018-140, 2018-141, 2018-142 and 2018-143, later that evening at the Formal Session of Council.

President Chris Hilbert stated that the proponents and opponents sides of the budget-related items will each receive a total of thirty minutes during the public hearing.

Councilor Kim Gray provided an introduction of a drafted amendment to Ord. 2018-110 and explained that the proposal would also require department directors, deputy chief administrative officers as well as Council's appointees to live in the city, with the exception of part-time personnel.

Councilor Andreas Addison stated that the city's residency requirement has been a deterrent for promotion and a negative aspect of the hiring process; he maintained that the proposed amendment to Ord. 2018-110 would not accomplish the initiate request to reduce the number of affected employees.

Councilor Parker Agelasto expressed his willingness to support the proposed amendment to Ord. 2018-110 after contemplating the city's emergency preparedness needs.

Councilor Michael Jones informed Council of constituents' opposition to Ord. 2018-110; however, he indicated that the current residency requirement was archaic and has been an abandoned prerequisite of employment for surrounding jurisdictions.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell reported that she had also received several complaints surrounding the removal of the residence requirement posed by Ord. 2018-110.

Councilor Andreas Addison expressed discomfort with the revised residency waiver process that the proposed amendment to Ord. 2018-110 would initiate, especially for employees not appointed by Council.

Councilor Kristen Larson also addressed concerns with the proposed change in the residency waiver process.

Councilor Kim Gray stated that the drafted amendment to Ord. 2018-110 provided a level of service accountability and transparency.

President Chris Hilbert read comments received in opposition to eliminating the residency requirement and stated that he will support the proposed amendment to Ord. 2018-110.

After further review of the drafted amendment to Ord. 2018-110, Councilor Parker Agelasto stated that he would not support the amendment in its current form unless certain non-essential personnel and changes to the waiver process were stricken.

City Attorney Allen Jackson informed Council that modifications to the proposed amendment to Ord 2018-110 would require additional time to prepare for introduction.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of Council to continue Ord. 2018-110 pending changes to the proposed amendment.
