Civilian Review Board

Ordinance No. 2022-261, adopted October 10, 2022, in accordance with Code of the Virginia, § 9.1-601, there is hereby created a board of the City of Richmond with indefinite duration to be known as the Civilian Review Board for the purpose of (i) reviewing, investigating and making recommendations to the Council, the Mayor, and the Chief of Police concerning internal investigations conducted by the Department of Police regarding (a) police officer-involved shootings; (b) deaths of persons while held in the custody of the Department of Police; (c) serious injuries to persons while in the custody of the Department of Police; (d) accusations of physical or verbal abuse by officers of the Department of Police; and (e) appeals by citizens of a finding or decision of the Department of Police; and (ii) providing recommendations on law enforcement practices, policies, and procedures. For purposes of section 2-773, the Board is classified as "advisory."

The Commission shall be composed of eight members, four of such members shall be appointed by the Council and four of such members shall be appointed by the Mayor.

Each member shall be a resident of the city of Richmond and shall maintain such residency during such member's tenure on the Board. No person currently or previously employed as a law-enforcement officer as defined in Code of Virginia, § 9.1-101 shall be appointed to the Board. No person who is a family or household member, as defined in Code of Virginia, § 16.1-228, of a person who is currently or who was previously employed as a law-enforcement officer, as defined in Code of Virginia, § 9.1-101, shall be appointed to the Board. No person who is a family or household member, as defined in Code of Virginia, § 9.1-101, shall be appointed to the Board. Ms. Carrie Cox has an impressive bio. A product of RVA public schools, she has gone on to achieve a reputation as staunch crusader and advocate for the overlooked population of Richmond, VA.

Ms. Cox began in 2001 with Woodland Crossing Apartments Tenant and Civic Association. Along with 5 other women she recognized something had to be done to quell the violence in the community. Violence was so rampart that mothers often put their children to sleep in the bathtub to avoid possible rick-a-shay gun shots. As President of Woodland Crossing Apartments Tenant and Civic Association, Ms. Cox enlisted assistance from Fattah Mohammed, Dir. Project SAFE, Chief Gooch and Cpt. Horn, RPD, 2nd Pct., and Verizon's Johnny Johnson. Thru partnership with RPD, Ms. Cox contacted RACE (Rescue & Aid for Communities Everywhere) and got the ball rolling to combat drug sales and related violence prevalent in the community. Verizon donated cell phones for tenant patrols to insure immediate police notification of illicit activity. Woodland Crossing is now a safe environment due to the efforts of Ms. Cox.

Once the complex exhibited a comfortable aura and the residents felt safe, Ms. Cox continued to enhance the community. She organized Annual Easter Egg Hunts-Christmas parties for children with toys and clothing donated by agencies e.g., Salvation Army, U.S. Marines-Toys for Tots, and various local businesses and entities. She got everybody involved. There was also Thanksgiving food boxes and back to school supplies distributions—a Girl Scout Troop, computer and English as a Second Language classes were initiated. With every life quality improvement achieved Ms. Cox moved on to further enhance Woodland Crossing and the surrounding Walmsley area. Community and political activities were started including Social Services (including psychologist), Crusades for Voters. There were Towne Hall meetings that allowed residents to participate in the new growth of their community. Some activities were on a regular basis, some on "as needed" basis. This was a monumental task to have people, agencies, and professionals commit their time and expertise. Ms. Carrie, as she likes to be called---- did it!

Once Woodland Crossing showed stability, Ms. Cox branched out and used her talents as a community activist to create a better living and work environment for the communities of RVA.
