WHAT IS IT?

- An inventory that asks all City Agencies to identify any services / initiatives / activities that are:
 - Geared to help eliminate poverty
 - Structured to enhance economic opportunity
 - Provide some level of support for those in poverty
- It was distributed to all City Agencies after adoption of the FY2019 budget



WHAT IS IN IT?

- Categories in the Inventory Include:
 - Services and Programming Focus
 - Expected Outcomes
 - Initiative Categories (Art, Culture and Recreation, Children & Youth, Community Services and Info, Education, Employment & Financial Assistance, etc.)
 - Type of Service / Program (At Risk, Safe, Stable or Thriving)
 - FY18 and FY19 Adopted Budgets (All Funds)
