ORDINANCES

1. To amend Ord. No. 2018-057, adopted May 14, 2018, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by transferring and re-appropriating \$1,175,000.00 from the Richmond Sheriff's Office Sheriff-Jail Operations program to the Richmond Sheriff's Office Sheriff-Jail Administration & Human Services program for the purpose of funding projected personnel costs. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
2. To amend ch. 2, art. III of the City Code by adding therein a new section 2-58, concerning restrictions on activities of former officers and employees, for the purpose of reflecting amendments to state law. (Mr. Agelasto, Ms. Larson, and Ms. Gray) **{Governmental Operations – April 25, 2019}**
3. To make grants from the Love Your Block Grant special fund to Boaz and Ruth, Inc., Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Richmond, Enrichmond Foundation, Saving Our Youth, Virginia, and The Salvation Army. **{Education and Human Services – May 2, 2019}**
4. To close, to public use and travel, a portion of West Marshall Street located between the west line of Hermitage Road and the eastern boundary of the property known as 2220 West Broad Street consisting of 41,468± square feet, but retaining portions as utility easements and access easements, upon certain terms and conditions, and to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept the dedication of a public access easement, consisting of 60,011± square feet, over certain parcels adjacent to the closed portion of West Marshall Street, in connection with vehicular and pedestrian access to a proposed mixed-use development in the area. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – May 6, 2019}**
5. To amend City Code ch. 2, art. IV, div. 1 by adding therein a new § 2-239, concerning value engineering, for the purpose of requiring value engineering for projects costing more than \$5,000,000.00. (Ms. Gray) **{Finance and Economic Development – May 16, 2019}**
6. To amend Ord. No. 2018-297, adopted Dec. 17, 2018, which created the Navy Hill Development Advisory Commission and announced the Council's intent to hold public hearings, all for the purpose of providing for the Council's consideration of a development proposal in the area generally bounded on the west by N. 5th St., on the north by E. Leigh St., on the east by N. 10th St., and on the south by E. Marshall St, to provide that the Commission shall furnish the Council with a final report no later than 90 calendar days following the date of introduction of the relevant ordinances instead

of 90 calendar days following the date on which a majority of the Commission's members are appointed. (Ms. Gray) **{Finance and Economic Development – May 16, 2019}**

7. To authorize a Highland Grove Preliminary Community Unit Plan permitting the development of a residential community of up to 155 dwelling units on approximately 40 acres of land located at 2651 Richmond Henrico Turnpike, 2641 Richmond Henrico Turnpike, 500 Dove Street, 509 Dove Street, and 2300 1st Avenue, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – May 20, 2019}**
8. To authorize the special use of the property known as 20 North Belmont Avenue for the purpose of up to two dwelling units as well as the principal and accessory uses permitted in the B-1 Neighborhood Business District, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – May 20, 2019}**
9. To authorize the special use of the property known as 804 North 22nd Street for the purpose of a multifamily dwelling containing up to four dwelling units and a single-family detached dwelling, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – May 20, 2019}**
