THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That Ordinance No. 2024-099, adopted May 13, 2024, which adopted a General Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, and made appropriations pursuant thereto, be and is hereby amended by:

- (a) Increasing estimated revenues from real estate taxes by \$12,000,000.00; and
- (b) Appropriating \$12,000,000.00 in estimated revenues described in subsection (a) of this section to new line items within the “Non Departmental & Central Appropriations” budget and various departments, as set forth on the document entitled “Attachment 1 – General Fund

§ 2. That, for the avoidance of doubt, \$2,000,000.00 of the estimated revenues described in subsection (a) of section 1 of this ordinance appropriated to the line item entitled “EDA for Affordable Housing Activities” within the “Non Departmental & Central Appropriations” budget, as set forth on the document entitled “Attachment 1 – General Fund Amendment,” a copy of which is incorporated into a made a part of this ordinance, be and is hereby authorized to be disbursed to the Economic Development Authority of the City of Richmond to support affordable housing initiatives.

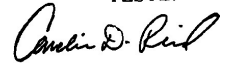
§ 3. That any unexpended amounts of the appropriation for the line item entitled “Local Social Services Board (for the Gap Grant program)” within the “Non Departmental & Central Appropriations” budget, as set forth on the document entitled “Attachment 1 – General Fund Amendment,” a copy of which is incorporated into a made a part of this ordinance, shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, and shall not revert to the general fund balance, as that term is defined by section 12-241 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2020), as amended, but shall remain in force until expended, revised, or repealed to the extent permitted by law. Any such unexpended amounts shall be accounted for by the Director of Finance in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall be available for appropriation in the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026, for the purpose of funding the line item entitled “Local Social Services Board (for the Gap Grant program)” within the “Non Departmental & Central Appropriations” budget, as set forth on the document entitled “Attachment 1 – General Fund Amendment,” a copy of which is incorporated into a made a part of this ordinance.

§ 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

RE: Spending Plan for Remaining Balance from Increase in Real Estate Tax Assessment

PURPOSE: To amend ordinance number 2024-099, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budgets by accepting \$12,000,000 in certified revenues as a result of increases from the Citywide assessed Real Estate valuation for taxable real property, and by increasing appropriations for new line items within the various departments, including the Central Appropriations budget.

BACKGROUND: The end of the first quarter the assessment roll values closed for the Citywide assessed Real Estate valuation for taxable real property by the Office of the City Assessor. The real estate market in the City of Richmond has continued to grow at a robust pace. The growth of the real estate market has caused the taxable real property revenue to exceed the budgeted amount. The certified additional revenue will be used to appropriate funding towards various city agencies. Based on the Tax Reassessment Notices supplied by the City Assessor, the land book values for the City of Richmond are in excess of the budgeted amounts for FY 2025. The Director of the Department of Finance has certified additional revenue in the amount of \$12,000,000. The administration seeks to appropriate the \$12,000,000 as follows to the FY 2025 budget:

Neighborhood and Community Services - \$679,500:

- \$679,500 will be appropriated to support out-of-school programs, as well as enhance support for homeless services, community outreach, and engagement.

Public Works - \$763,500:

- \$763,500 will be appropriated to address safety issues within the Public Safety building, as well as facility maintenance for the courthouse and City Council offices.

Parks & Recreation - \$457,000:

- \$457,000 will be appropriated to support funding of six additional elementary sites for afterschool programming.

Central Appropriations - \$10,100,000:

- \$4,000,000 will be appropriated in a new line item, titled “Demolition Fund,” for the purpose of supporting city demolition projects.
- \$3,900,000 will be appropriated in a new line item, titled “Local Social Services Board,” for the Gap Grant program.
- \$2,000,000 will be appropriated in a new line item, titled “Transfer to the Economic Development Authority (EDA) for Affordable Housing Activities,” for the purpose of supporting affordable housing development, to be transferred to the EDA by the Department of Economic Development.
- \$200,000 will be appropriated to establish the Real Estate Freeze Program

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT: The appropriation includes funding for affordable housing projects, as well as funding for housing grants for needy persons.
