By virtue of the authority vested in the United States of America, Commonwealth of Virginia, Virginia Code of Laws, and the Richmond City Charter, Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, does hereby and officially proclaim:

Richmond AmeriCorps Week

Whereas, Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, does hereby recognize, honor, and celebrate the value of public civil service and volunteerism; and

Whereas, established in 1993, AmeriCorps is an independent federal agency for national service and volunteerism and provides opportunities for Americans to help address pressing challenges on behalf of improving the lives of individuals, families, and communities; and

WHEREAS, begun in Virginia in 1995, AmeriCorps local services in Richmond include five programs, 22 service sites, 59 AmeriCorps members, and work that includes serving RHOPE and RVA Health Corps programs; and

WHEREAS, last year, nearly 3,000 AmeriCorps service members across the Commonwealth assisted in more than 400 locations on behalf of efforts that included health services, child and youth mentoring, environmental restoration, disaster response, and addiction recovery; and

Whereas, in America, public civil service and volunteerism are considered to be among the highest and most noble work a person can do and fundamental to the continued success, progress, and happiness of our families, communities, cities, states, and country; and

Whereas, Richmond City Council is a strong advocate, supporter, and champion of public civil service and volunteerism and is proud to commend AmeriCorps and thank its dedicated staff, volunteers, supporters, and our community for their critical efforts in making it possible;
