PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$10,000,000.00 from the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration ("PHMSA") through the Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization Grant program, and to appropriate the funds received to the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget by increasing revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Public Utilities' Gas Utility enterprise funds for the purpose of funding the Richmond Gas Works Cast Iron Renewal Program. Richmond Gas Works has identified, and PHMSA has approved, nine (9) projects in historically disadvantaged areas that will help to accelerate the Richmond Gas Works Cast Iron Renewal Program. The renewal of these legacy cast and ductile iron pipelines and the associated service lines will help to reduce methane emissions and significantly improve the gas system's reliability and resiliency.

The Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization BACKGROUND:

("NGDISM") grant program is a new grant program that helps improve public safety, protect public health, and reduce methane emissions from natural gas distribution pipelines. The

NGDISM grant program, established by President Biden's historic Bipartisan Infrastructure Law,

provides nearly \$1 billion in funding over the course of five years to modernize municipally- and

community-owned natural gas distribution pipelines, helping to keep communities across the

country safe from pipeline leaks. The first year of grant winners has been selected, and U.S.

Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg and PHMSA have announced a historic \$196 million in

grants for 37 projects spread across 19 states. For the first year, a cap of \$10,000,000.00 (ten

million dollars and zero cents) was set for any one grant winner. Richmond Gas Works is

honored to have been selected and awarded the maximum amount allowable by PHMSA.

Congratulations! The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's (PHMSA) Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization (NGDISM) grant program has provisionally selected the City of Richmond to receive an award in the amount of \$10,000,000. As you know, the purpose of this grant is to assist in the repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of aging, leak-prone distribution pipeline infrastructure, and the acquisition of equipment to (1) reduce incidents and fatalities and (2) avoid economic losses.

The number of competitive applications and their funding requests well exceeded the statutorily available funding of \$200 million (including \$4 million in administrative costs) in any one fiscal year for the NGDISM Grant Program. In total, applicants requested over \$1.2 billion in funding for a 5-year \$1 billion program in the first year alone. Due to the demand, PHMSA elected to implement a \$10 million cap so that more entities could receive funding. Additionally, PHMSA elected to cap all contingency costs to 10 percent.

This letter will cover pre-award costs, special terms and conditions of the award, next steps for the Tier 2 Environmental Assessment process, and any project(s) that PHMSA has deemed not acceptable.

#### **Pre-Award Costs**

Recipients cannot expend grant funds or begin work involving construction, renovation, repair, rehabilitation, or ground or visual disturbance on a project awarded a NGDISM grant until PHMSA concludes its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and related Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act reviews (40 CFR Part 1500, 54 USC § 306108, and 36 CFR Part 800).

Reviews will be considered complete when PHMSA issues a Tier 2 Site Specific Environmental Assessment and a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI).

Recipients may request pre-award authority from PHMSA to allow for approved non-construction preparatory activity costs to be reimbursed once the NEPA and Section 106 reviews are completed. These costs include, but are not limited to, architectural and engineering designs, environmental and historic preservations reviews, permitting, and licenses. Note that even with PHMSA's prior approval to incur pre-award costs, the allowability of pre-award costs is subject to the cost principles in 2 CFR Subpart E.

## **Special Terms and Conditions**

The award is contingent upon completion of the Tier 2 Environmental Assessment and attendance at a PHMSA Civil Rights training webinar.

In addition, the award is contingent upon your organization submitting a revised application to PHMSA which reduces the total budget to no more than \$10,000,000 and removes any project(s) deemed not acceptable (see below).

### **Next Steps for the Tier 2 Environmental Assessment**

PHMSA will require the completion of the Tier 2 Environmental Assessment and other administrative tasks using PowerApps, and PHMSA will provide provisional selectees with access to this tool. PowerApps is software that will facilitate real-time communication between PHMSA and your organization. For the completion of the Tier 2 Environmental Assessment, please list up to three points of contact who will need access to PowerApps. This should include each point of contact's name, email address, and role in completing the assessment.

## **Project(s) Deemed Not Acceptable**

PHMSA has deemed the Risk and Security Assessment which was budgeted for \$316,545.00. not acceptable.
