WHEREAS, sections 8-7 through 8-10 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, generally prescribe a process for the naming of City facilities such as the basketball courts at the Pine Camp Cultural Arts and Community Center located at 4901 Old Brook Road; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Richmond that the such basketball courts be named “The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp” without the necessity for strict compliance with the requirements set forth in sections 8-7 through 8-10 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended;

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That, notwithstanding the provisions of sections 8-7 through 8-10 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, or any other law to the contrary, the basketball courts at the Pine Camp Cultural Arts and Community Center located at 4901 Old Brook Road be and are hereby named as “The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp.”

§ 2. That, in order to effectuate the provisions of section 1 of this ordinance, the Chief Administrative Officer shall (i) cause the appropriate City agency to prepare and erect signs appropriately marking “The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp,” (ii) request that all City agencies note such naming in the records maintained by each such agency, and (iii) take all other appropriate actions to effectuate the naming of the basketball courts as “The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp.”

§ 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

**PURPOSE:** To authorize the City of Richmond to agree to the naming of the basketball courts at Pine Camp to "The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp".

**REASON:** This year Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities and CarMax are celebrating their 12<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the partnership they have enjoyed since 2006.

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities recommends acceptance of this request to name the basketball courts at Pine Camp after the CEO of CarMax, Mr. Tom Folliard.

**BACKGROUND:** CarMax and its Foundation with the vision and leadership of Tom Folliard have invested over one million dollars towards the Pine Camp basketball court facility through their partnership with Richmond City's Department of Parks, Recreation, and Community Facilities. For the past 11 years funds provided by CarMax have paid for the renovation of two basketball courts and the construction and installation of a third basketball court. Tom's direction for the renovation and construction of a third court established a standard for department's outdoor basketball courts such as painted court surfaces with lining and glass backboards with breakaway rims. CarMax also provided other amenities at the site to include bleachers for spectators, player benches, and the complete renovation of a condemned playground building converted into a concession and multi-purpose facility.

Funds each year also pay for security from the City's police department (on average nine officers), meals for youth participants, game officials, player uniforms, coaches shirts, program supplies and equipment, staff (9 court monitors and 2 league coordinators) to monitor and supervise games. Each

year the league registers approximately 48 teams with 12 players on each team for approximately 576 youth participants.

Tom Folliard, former CEO of CarMax and current Board Member, has demonstrated a commitment to our youth and City to support our services with program and facility funding. Tom Folliard and the CarMax Foundation is a noteworthy partner of the department and City.
