Clean City Commission

Vacancies as of February 8, 2026

The commission shall be composed of 17 members as follows:

- one member from each City Council district who resides or has a principal place of employment in such district shall be appointed, and
- five members shall be at-large corporate or community representatives, shall not be subject to any requirement that they maintain a residence or principal place of employment in the city.
- 2 members who reside or have a principal place of employment in the city appointed by the Mayor

The Director of Public Works or the designee thereof shall serve as an ex officio member.

However, if a member who resides or has a principal place of employment in a Council district has not been identified and appointed within 180 days from the date of a vacancy, the Council, with the approval of the member of the Council member representing the Council district for which a vacancy has occurred, may appoint any person who resides or has a principal place of employment in the city to fill such vacancy. Members who are appointed to fill vacancies or unexpired terms may serve immediately upon appointment and qualification.



Ordinance No. 2023-315, adopted November 13, 2023, established a Public Utilities and Services Commission of the City of Richmond to advise the Council and the Mayor on matters involving the operation, maintenance, and expansion of the City's public utilities, including natural gas, clean drinking water, wastewater, solid waste, and stormwater.

The Commission shall be composed 13 voting members and eight non-voting members: The Council shall appoint **eight** members, and (2) The Mayor shall appoint **five** members.

The voting membership shall consist of commercial or residential public utilities customers who are residents of the City... Of the 13 voting members, there should be at least one residing north side of the James River and at least one residing south side of the James River. No current Council members, officers, or employees of the City shall be eligible for appointment... four ex-officio, non-voting members recommended by the Mayor, one of whom shall serve as a representative of the Department of Public Utilities, the Department of Public Works, the Office of Sustainability, and the Richmond and Henrico Health District and (ii) four non-voting members consisting of one public utilities department head, or the designees thereof, each employed by the counties of Hanover, Henrico, Chesterfield, and Goochland, respectively.


