### ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

To approve of the City's participation in the proposed settlement of opioid-related claims against McKesson, Cardinal Health, AmerisourceBergen, Janssen Pharmaceuticals, and their related corporate entities, and to direct the City Attorney to execute the documents necessary to effectuate the City's participation in the settlements, including the required release of claims against the settling entities.

#### **BACKGROUND**

By Res. No. 2018–R094, adopted Nov. 13, 2018, the City Council established a policy to pursue legal action on behalf of the City against drug manufacturers and distributors of opioids. Pursuant to Ord. No. 2021-234, adopted Sept. 27, 2021, the City entered into a Virginia Opioid Abatement Fund and Settlement Allocation Memorandum of Understanding with the Attorney General of Virginia providing for the allocation and use of monies recovered through litigation concerning the opioid addiction epidemic. In order to receive as much as \$6.8 million (based on the calculations of the Office of the Attorney General of Virginia and assuming governmental participation in Virginia nears 100 percent) from settlements with opioid distributors McKesson, AmerisourceBergen, and Cardinal, and opioid manufacturer Janssen Pharmaceuticals, the City Council must adopt a resolution authorizing the City's participation in these settlements prior to January 2, 2022. Over 30 other Virginia localities have already adopted similar resolutions. The City Attorney, the Office of the Attorney General of Virginia, and the City's outside counsel recommend that the City participate in these settlements.
