















# Implementation: Reporting

- Other Goals: A summary of any other actions undertaken in an effort to advance any of the 17 Goals outlined in Chapters 2 through 6 of that have transpired since the last Annual Report was published.

#### Funding

The feasibility study positions Richmond to hopefully have a competitive application for State and Federal funding opportunities.

#### Construction

Once funded, construction documents would be developed and construction would commence.
