



Jahnke Road Improvement Project Overview

The Jahnke Road Improvement Project is designed to improve traffic safety, improve traffic flow and enhance overall livability for the residents and users of the Jahnke Road Corridor. Jahnke Road not only carries automobile traffic, but also pedestrians, cyclists, GRTC bus riders and children who attend the three public schools located along the project corridor.

Important project elements within the design will include a shared use path, sidewalks, and landscaping. The existing roadway drainage will be upgraded from an open system with roadside ditches to a closed system with storm sewer pipe and curb and gutter which will eliminate areas slow to drain during prolonged periods of heavy rainfall.

Current funding is available for engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction.

Project Status

Construction plans are complete and the project will be re-advertised for construction Late Spring 2023. The acquisition of right-of-way and easements for roadway construction, drainage improvements and utility relocations has concluded by the City Consultant, Stantec, for a total of 84 parcels.

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Shockoe Valley Streets Improvement Project

Project Summary and Scope

Shockoe Valley Streets Improvment smart scale project provides a comprehensive set of improvements in the vicinity of the Broad Street interchange. Some of the corridors and intersections improvements based on Traffic analysis will include Oliver Hill & Venable Street (newly proposed roundabout), Venable St and 18th street (new roundabout), Mosby and Venable St (Roundabout), 17th Street and Broad Street (new traffic signal), MLK bridge, Mosby and "O" Street (new roundabout). Some streets like 18th Street from Balding to Broad and Oliver Hill from Broad will be converted after traffic analysis from one-way to two-way traffic. The goals of this project is to improve safety, improve multi modal Transportation, Environmental Sustainability, Econimic development and land use.

VDOT conducted a planning study in 2012-2013 of the I-95/64 Overlap area in the City of Richmond and Henrico County. The purpose of this study was to identify potential transportation and safety improvements within the study area. Several potential improvements were identified, including the "I-95 Broad Street Interchange Area" project. In June 2016 this project was selected as a HB-2 project (now called smart scale) and awarded \$28,043,000 in federal allocations in VDOT's Six-Year plan.

(3) A project that results in the development or redevelopment of a specific geographic area within the boundaries of the City of Richmond that involves a significant contribution from the City and is not a project described in subsection (1) or (2) of this definition.

Significant contribution means one or more City expenditures reasonably attributable to any phase of a project, whether made directly to a business or to a political subdivision, that, when considered together, total \$3,000,000.00 or more.

Sec. 2-1337. - General requirements.

The department of information technology shall maintain on the website of the City a webpage entitled "development and capital improvement projects." The purpose of this webpage is to provide an internet location at which public information concerning projects is electronically published for public access. For each project, the webpage shall contain a hyperlink to a subsidiary page dedicated to that project. The department of information technology shall establish procedures whereby, as the department of information technology deems appropriate, either (i) the employees with responsibility for managing a project or an aspect of a project submits the information required by Section 2-1338 to the department of information technology on a regular basis and the department of information technology updates the subsidiary webpage for that project or (ii) the employee or employees with responsibility for managing a project or an aspect of a project update the subsidiary webpage for that project with the information required by Section 2-1338 on a regular basis.
