Dear Mayor Jones:

As you know, review and approval of the City's biennial fiscal plan is one of Council's most important responsibilities. Richmond City Council's goal is to work collaboratively with your Administration to make the upcoming Fiscal Year 17-18 budget review process both substantive and productive for the residents of the City of Richmond. To that end, we appreciate the participation of the City's administrative staff in Council's annual budget retreat and their follow up discussion regarding your identified priorities for the upcoming budget. As in years past, we know there are many competing interests for limited resources. I would like to share Council's collective top priorities for the upcoming budget process, in the hope that you will consider them for incorporation into your final Proposed Budget for the upcoming fiscal year. Our priorities following five major areas are:

1. Education

While Council understands that the Richmond Public Schools Board is responsible for the operation of the City's school system, Council places paramount importance on our role in considering and ultimately, approving a budget that provides City funding for the Richmond Public Schools system. As you know, access to a quality education is the single most important factor in reducing the generational poverty cycle, increasing employability and increasing long-term income. By identifying education as a priority, we support funding for schools that affords RPS the ability to improve outcomes for early childhood development and academic achievement citywide. Additionally, City Council supports allowing Richmond Public Schools to directly receive and use the FY 16 adopted capital funds budgeted in the School Planning and Construction project. This is conditioned on the School Board assuring the City of how those funds will be used and that it does not financially obligate the City or Council to a future course of action and funding without an agreed upon direction.

2. Community Development and Poverty Reduction

Richmond City Council has demonstrated their support of the Mayor's goal to reduce poverty in the City of Richmond, as evidenced by our approval of establishing the Department of Community Wealth Building. Again, Council understands this is a long-term issue that directly impacts the City's future as the Commonwealth of Virginia's capital city. Council continues to support funding efforts to improve delivery of services by the Department of Social Services, along

with workforce development programs that connect residents to jobs. It is our belief that these will provide the most value for our limited resources. However, this year it is even more pressing that we highlight as a priority our support for funding that allows the City's improvement strategies to include effective program assessment tools that will allow us to accurately focus current and future programming needs in the manner that allows us to make the most gains possible in reducing poverty.

3. Human Resources

Richmond City Council remains appreciative and supportive of Richmond City employees, who serve as the very foundation of our operations. During the last few budget cycles Council has identified the need for a comprehensive process to review the competitiveness of the City's compensation and benefits for all employees as they relate to both the ability to remain competitive with surrounding employers and to recruit the best applicants. This led to our full support of cost of living increases for employees and a solution for the City's public safety (Fire and Police) employees, which addresses career development and competitive pay with surrounding localities. We request your continued support of our efforts.

However, as our resources continue to be limited, we feel strongly that further investment in our employees requires the City to conduct a city-wide workforce analysis to determine if departments are properly staffed, to provide the optimal level of service. We envision an in-depth review of all 4,423 positions in approximately 500 different job classifications. We are requesting full funding of the estimated cost of conducting this analysis in the FY 17 Biennial Fiscal Plan.

4. Capital Improvement Plan 2016-2021

The City's investment in long-term capital projects, directly impacts the quality of life of our residents and it is an indication of our financial health to be able to fund infrastructure projects. While we have made great progress this past year, in anticipation of our role on the world stage, Council strongly believes that continuing to address the City's roads (paving) and sidewalks is a top priority. I would like to convey Council's continued support of these efforts and request Administration's continued commitment to this initiative. Such support includes the City's investment in fleet replacement with equipment that provides several services that residents truly value such as: alley maintenance; paving; street markings; refuse and leaf collections; along with street sweeping and, snow removal. It is understood future funding allocations must be balanced with the mounting costs the City can expect, as it relates to funding deferred maintenance for a myriad of City assets to include Richmond Public Schools. Consequently, as Council is well aware that the City is very close to our selfimposed debt ceiling limits, Council would like to be apprised of Administration's plan to review all existing CIP projects to see if they are complete or can be delayed to provide more capacity for funding critical infrastructure needs.

5. Economic Development

Council continues to support City's economic development strategy and commends you for the successes you have brought the City. We support continued focus on:

- · enhanced business retention efforts
- · revitalization of the City's commercial corridors
- · business recruitment for the services/retailers residents desire
- · incorporation of workforce development
- · increased poverty and unemployment reduction efforts
- continued progress on transformation of the City's concentrated public housing, to include overall improvement of quality housing for all income levels.

As you can see, there are many areas where we are in agreement with your priorities that were conveyed to us. In conveying Council's priorities I look forward to them receiving your careful consideration as you complete the development of the upcoming proposed FY 17 – 19 Biennial Fiscal Plan and Capital Improvement Plan. Council looks forward to working with you to collectively move the City of Richmond forward. As the City's legislative body, Council fully understands our duty to review and approve the City's budget, as the ultimate act of stewardship, especially in a time of limited resources. We fully intend to be a collegial partner in the process.


