RESOLUTION OF THE RICHMOND CITY PLANNING COMMISSION APPROVING A SECTION 17.05 REVIEW OF THE PUBLIC ART INSTALLATION AT THE MANCHESTER COURTHOUSE, 920 HULL STREET

WHEREAS, construction began in May of 2008 for the expansion of Richmond's historic Manchester Courthouse, which included the installation of a landscaped brick plaza located along the 9th Street side of the building that serves as the main entrance for visitors to the courthouse.

WHEREAS, the Public Art Commission has selected public artwork in the form of a bronze medallion to be installed in the aforementioned brick plaza, pursuant to the City's percent-for-art program and the Public Art Commission's procedures for the selection of such artwork.

WHEREAS, at its October 14, 2014 meeting, upon a motion made by Ms. Morrison and seconded by Ms. Driggs, the Public Art Commission voted (7,0) to recommend approval of the medallion and its location in the brick plaza.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Planning Commission of the City of Richmond, Virginia, reviewed the proposal in accordance with Section 17.05 of the City Charter (2005), as amended,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Commission having held a public hearing on the proposed public art installation on November 17, 2014, hereby approves said proposal.
