1. <u>ORD.</u> 2021-078 To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept \$2,067,260.00 from the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Public Works' Shared Mobility Special Fund by \$2,067,260.00 for the purpose of funding the BRT Red-Colored Pavement Program on Broad Street from Willow Lawn to Rocketts Landing.

Code § 36-105.

Broad Street) - DJS/ADC Renovations project by \$352,000.00 for the purpose of renovating the Theatre Row Building located at 730 East Broad Street for use by the Department of Justice Services and the Adult Drug Court program.
