WHEREAS, Earl A. Robinson was instrumental in raising awareness and preserving understanding of life in the community of Historic Fulton, located in the east end of the city of Richmond, through his dedicated work in recording oral history interviews with people who knew the area before the urban renewal activities of the 1970s in the Fulton area and contributing greatly to the Historic Fulton Oral History Project maintained by The Valentine Museum; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to memorialize Mr. Robinson's contributions to the civic well-being of the city of Richmond and the Commonwealth of Virginia as an advocate for preserving the history of the Fulton area by designating the 700 block of Goddin Street in his honor; and

WHEREAS, because this designation is honorary only, the provisions of sections 8-7 through 8-10 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, do not apply to the designation made hereby or to any signs erected pursuant to this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. **Designation of Street Block for Honorary Name.** The 700 block of Goddin Street shall be designated in honor of Earl A. Robinson, pursuant to this ordinance.

§ 2. **Effect of Designation.** The designation of the street block made pursuant to this ordinance shall be honorary only, shall not replace the existing name of the street, and shall have no effect on the address of any property with an address on the designated street block. The sole effect of designation pursuant to this ordinance shall be to authorize the placement of commemorative signs in accordance with this ordinance memorializing the designation in honor of the named person.

§ 3. **Administration of Ordinance.** The Department of Public Works shall implement this ordinance by installing, as soon as practicable after the adoption of this ordinance, and maintaining commemorative signs in accordance with this section. The commemorative signs shall be clearly distinct from the street signs used to identify the street block in question such that a reasonable person could not conclude that the commemorative signs reflect the actual name of the street. The commemorative signs shall be affixed to the street sign for the street designated in section 1 of this ordinance located at each end of the street block designated in section 1 of this ordinance and shall bear the name of the person set forth in section 1 of this ordinance.

§ 4. **Effective Date.** This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

The patron requests that legislation be drafted for Council's consideration that designates the 700th block of Goodin Street, between Fulton Street and Goodin Circle, in honor of the late Mr. Earl Robinson.

BACKGROUND

The City has occasionally made designations of City blocks in honor of persons who have contributed to the Richmond's history. The late Mr. Robinson worked as an amateur historian to preserve the history of Richmond's Fulton community by recording the memories and oral histories of residents and former residents. Much of Mr. Robinson's work was focused on preserving the history of the area prior to the City's and RRHA's urban renewal project that destroyed much of the then majority-black community.

Mr. Robinson conducted his oral histories by interview of residents and former residents. His interviews are preserved as part of the Historic Fulton Oral History Project. The project was supported by Virginia LISC, and records of the project are preserved at The Valentine, The Neighborhood Resource Center of Greater Fulton, and the Greater Fulton Legacy Team, and VCU.
