

Re: 2101 - 2103 W Main St. Project Narrative

The encroachment application for these two properties will legitimize outdoor dining rights that were granted during the COVID 19 pandemic. At that time, the Department of Public Works came to the site and physically indicated where they would allow outdoor dining that essentially conformed to the standards and requirements of their department as well as the Sidewalk Cafe Design Guidelines.

At this time, DPW has requested that an administrative encroachment application be submitted for both properties (having the same owner with two separate LLCs).


There are two areas of encroachment being proposed.

The first is on the side of the building along S Rowland St. A series of small two top tables with chairs will be placed against the building with a painted metal framework that will carry the required barricade separating the dining space from the remaining sidewalk as well as the overhead fabric awning that will attach to the building.

The second encroachment will be in front of the building on W Main St. This will consist of a continuous painted wooden bench, small tables and chairs all enclosed by a 36" high painted metal barricade similar to the ones along the side of the building. Small, free standing, market type umbrellas may be set between the tables for shading purposes.

The documents and materials submitted to the Department of Public Works for their Administrative Approval are also attached to this application.

The applicant will commence with this work upon receiving approval. The first step being the removal of the temporary installation granted during the Covid emergency.



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
