EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$1,600.00 from the Council District Funds for the Sixth District to make a payment to Storefront for Community Design as a donation to the Manchester Alliance neighborhood association for designing and implementing a community engagement workshop for the Manchester community. (Mrs. Robertson)
2. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$300.00 from the Council District Funds for the Ninth District to pay Marion Marketing Global, LLC for designing and printing 400 palm cards providing notice of a change in date from July 12, 2018, to July 10, 2018, for the Ninth District Community Meeting. (Mr. Jones)

MOTION TO AMEND

3. To amend Res. No. 2018-R045, which requests that the Chief Administrative Officer annually cause to be conducted a review of dedicated funding strategies for Richmond Public Schools and provide the Council, the Mayor, and the School Board of the City of Richmond with recommendations concerning (i) the total budget appropriation for Richmond Public Schools for each ensuing fiscal year, (ii) funding sources for Richmond Public Schools, and (iii) any proposed changes to state legislation necessary to increase state funding to Richmond Public Schools, to request instead a single review of funding strategies for Richmond Public Schools and recommendations concerning a potential local funding approach for future budgets including any proposed changes to state legislation necessary to increase state funding.

To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept grant funds in the amount of \$30,000.00 from the Local Initiatives Support Corporation, and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police's LISC - Midnight Basketball special fund by \$30,000.00 for the purpose of supporting the Department of Police's RVA League for Safer Streets program. **{No Committee Referral Pursuant to Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**

6. To amend City Code § 2-300, concerning the appointment, powers, and duties of the Director of Economic Development, for the purpose of clarifying the City's intent that the Director of Economic Development serve as the Executive Director of the Economic Development Authority. (Mr. Addison) **{Committee Referral Waived Pursuant to Rule VI(B)(2)}**
7. To amend ch. 24, art. II, div. 1 of the City Code by adding therein a new section 24-34.1, concerning the duties of businesses to remove refuse from paved sidewalks and provide refuse receptacles for public use. (Mrs. Robertson) **{Public Safety – July 24, 2018}**
8. To amend City Code § 8-441, concerning the designation of days and hours when the 17th Street Farmer's Market will be open and closed for vendors, for the purpose of providing for the designation of hours when the 17th Street Farmer's Market is open and closed to the public. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – August 21, 2018}**
9. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Lease Agreement between the City of Richmond as lessor and Capital Area Health Network, doing business as the Vernon J. Harris East End Community Health Center, as lessee for the purpose of providing health center office space for the Vernon J. Harris East End Community Health Center at 719 North 25th Street. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – August 21, 2018}**
10. To adopt an amendment to the Master Plan for the City of Richmond, adopted by the City Planning Commission on Nov. 6, 2000, and by the City Council by Ord. No. 2000-371-2001-11, adopted Jan. 8, 2001, as previously amended, to incorporate the Public Art Master Plan, as part of the Master Plan. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – August 21, 2018}**
11. To erect all-way stop signs and mark crosswalks on all approaches at the intersections of West 7th Street and Perry Street, West 7th Street and Porter Street, and West 7th Street and Bainbridge Street. (Mrs. Robertson) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – September 18, 2018 (60-DAY PAPER)}**
12. To designate the 100 block of Larne Avenue in honor of Yvonne Spain. (Mr. Agelasto) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – August 21, 2018}**
13. To close to vehicular travel North 17th Street between East Franklin Street and East Main Street, consisting of approximately 23,761± square feet, for the purpose of

- creating an urban plaza centered around the 17th Street Farmer's Market, upon certain terms and conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
14. To amend City Code §§ 30-504, 30-506—30-507.1, 30-509—30-523, and 30-1220; to amend ch. 30, art. V, div. 1 by adding therein new §§ 30-504.01 and 30-504.02; and to amend the fees set forth in Appendix A of the City Code for sections 30-1050.6(a) and 30-1050.6(b), for the purpose of modifying the City's zoning ordinance to ensure the proper administration and implementation of the City's sign regulations. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
 15. To conditionally rezone the properties known as 3 Manchester Road, 3A Manchester Road, and 2 Hull Street from the RF-1 Riverfront District to the B-4 Central Business District (Conditional), upon certain proffered conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
 16. To conditionally rezone the properties known as 700 North 3rd Street; 200, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213, 214, 215, 216, 217, and 218 Maggie L. Walker Place; and 701, 703, 705, 707, 709, 723, and 745 North 2nd Street from the R-53 Multifamily Residential District to the B-7 Mixed-Use Business District (Conditional), upon certain proffered conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
 17. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 93-271-235, adopted Oct. 11, 1993, which authorized the use of the property known as 1133 West Franklin Street for the purpose of conversion and use of the existing building as offices, Sunday school rooms, and meeting rooms accessory to the existing church at 1205 West Franklin Street, and as a single dwelling unit, together with accessory parking, to authorize additional signage, upon certain terms and conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
 18. To authorize the special use of the properties known as 2600 Idlewood Avenue and 309 South Robinson Street for the purpose of a social service delivery use and accessory parking, upon certain terms and conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**
 19. To authorize the special use of the property known as 3400 Stony Point Road for the purpose of limited special events, upon certain terms and conditions. **{Planning Commission – September 4, 2018}**

RESOLUTIONS

24. To express the City Council’s intent to include in its legislative proposals for the 2019 session of the General Assembly a request that the General Assembly amend Va. Code § 15.2-1408 to authorize the City to adopt an ordinance prohibiting former officers and employees, for one year after their terms of office have ended or employment ceased, from providing personal and substantial assistance for remuneration of any kind to any party, in connection with any proceeding, application, case, contract, or other particular matter involving the City or an agency thereof, if that matter is one in which the former officer or employee participated personally and substantially as a City officer or employee through decision, approval, or recommendation. 25. To express the sense of the City Council that the General Assembly of Virginia should grant the City Council the authority to determine the disposition of memorials and monuments such as the statues commemorating J.E.B. Stuart, Robert E. Lee, Jefferson Davis, Thomas “Stonewall” Jackson, and Matthew Fontaine Maury located on Monument Avenue between its intersections with Belmont Avenue and Lombardy Street so that the City Council may determine such disposition of these statues as it deems appropriate. 26. To increase the salary of Amy E. Robins as a Council Liaison for the City of Richmond from \$59,000.00 annually to \$63,000.00 annually. (Mr. Agelasto) **{Finance and Economic Development – September 20, 2018}**
