Councilor Katherine Jordan requested Ord. 2020-217 be stricken in light of Governor Ralph Northam's proposed historic justice initiatives, which include funding to support an unified approach to transforming Monument Avenue.

Chris Frelke, Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities director, stated that city administration is not opposed to the striking of Ord. 2020-217 and supports a collaborative initiative for reimagining Monument Avenue.

Councilor Kristen Larson raised concerns regarding the striking of Ord. 2020-217 while awaiting finalization of the governor's proposal.

It was the consensus of Council to strike Ord. 2020-217 later that evening during the Formal Session of Council.

# Richmond Resort Casino Development Request for Qualifications and Proposal (RFQ/P) <u>Update</u>

Leonard Sledge, Economic Development director, presented Council with an update regarding the city's resort casino development request for qualifications and proposals, which included information concerning the history of the Commonwealth's casino act, Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission study, RFQ/P timeline, survey results and community engaging. A copy of the presentation has been filed.

Interim City Attorney Haskell Brown asked for an opportunity to examine state laws in order to best advise Council concerning certain casino solicitations.

Councilor Ann-Frances Lambert requested to participate on the casino RFQ/P's evaluation and selection committee.

Vice President Ellen Robertson requested a revised RFQ/P timeline to include Council approval dates for specific required actions involving the proposed casino.

President Cynthia Newbille asked to be contacted if any other members of Council were interested in serving on the casino RFQ/P evaluation and selection committee.

### **Tax Amnesty Program Proposal**

John Wack, Finance director, presented information concerning a proposed 2021 tax amnesty program for real estate, and admission, lodging and meals taxes scheduled to be introduced later that evening at the Formal Session of Council. A copy of the presentation has been filed.

Acting Chief Administrative Officer Lincoln Saunders was available to answer questions pertaining to the proposed tax amnesty program.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell expressed concern regarding the accessibility of applying to participate in the tax amnesty program for citizens.

Councilor Kristen Larson notified city administration of issues regarding the dissemination of real estate tax bills.

Councilor Andreas Addison suggested city real estate tax bills be available online.

### **City Attorney Recruitment Process**

Interim Council Chief of Staff Meghan Brown provided an update regarding the city attorney recruitment process.

President Cynthia Newbille stated that the next step would be the formation of an interview panel.

Councilor Andreas Addison suggested different marketing strategies for the city attorney recruitment process as a result of minimal interest and in an effort to widen the candidate pool.
