<p>HB 1191 - Ransone - Marcus alert system; participation in the system is optional for localities, etc.</p>	<p>(H) Committee on Public Safety</p>	<p>Passed House Committee 12-9 with a substitute bill that allows extra time for implementation, requires additional reporting by the state agencies involved, and creates a workgroup of smaller localities to identify barriers to implementation and provide recommendations to address those barriers. On House floor for vote on Mon./Tues.</p>	
<p>SB 361 - Stuart - Marcus alert system; optional participation, voluntary database.</p>	<p>(S) Committee on Education and Health</p>	<p><u>Passed Senate 40-0 with substitute bill</u> that allows optional participation in the Marcus Alert system by localities under 40,000 but would still require that all localities develop local protocols to divert calls from 9-1-1 dispatch to a crisis call center for risk assessment and engagement, including deployment of mobile crisis or community care teams if such teams are available.</p>
