EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To consent to the Mayor's appointment of JuWon Davis as a member of the Education Compact Team established by the Mayor.

MOTION TO AMEND

2. To amend Ord. No. 2018-127, which amends ch. 2, art. VII, div. 4.1 of the City Code by adding therein a new § 2-1366.10, concerning requirements for reports made to the City Council, for the purpose of requiring that datasets used to prepare reports made to the City Council and its standing committees be published to the open data portal, to modify the publication requirements for such datasets.

ORDINANCES

3. To amend Ord. No. 2017-136, adopted Jul. 24, 2017, which authorized the Chief Administrative Officer to accept \$1,982,866.40 from the Virginia Department of Social Services, to transfer matching funds in the total amount of \$671,857.01 from Fiscal Year 2017-2018 General Fund Budget appropriations to the Office of Community Wealth Building, created a new special fund for the Office of Community Wealth Building in the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Special Fund Budget entitled "TANF RVA GPS," and appropriated funds in the total amount of \$2,654,723.41 to the new TANF RVA GPS special fund, for the purpose of hiring program personnel for and providing training, work experiences, structured workshops, and supportive services to participants in the RVA Guiding People to Success program, to modify the amount appropriated from \$2,654,723.41 to \$1,982,866.40 by eliminating the transfer of matching funds in the amount of \$671,857.01. **{No Committee Referral Pursuant to Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
4. To amend Ord. No. 2017-037, adopted May 15, 2017, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Special Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by increasing estimated revenues from the dog and cat annual license program and the amount appropriated to the Office of Animal Care and Control's Pet License Collections special fund by \$60,000.00 to support expenditures pursuant to Va. Code § 3.2-6534. **{No Committee Referral Pursuant to Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
5. To approve the Work Plan and Budget for the fiscal year ending Jun. 30, 2019, for the provision of services in the Downtown Richmond Special Service and Assessment Districts. (President Hilbert) **{Finance and Economic Development – May 17, 2018}**

6. To amend Ord. No. 2017-036, adopted May 15, 2017, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by reducing total appropriations by \$3,715,802.00, transferring funds from various agencies and non-departmental programs in the City's accounting system, and appropriating the transferred funds to various agencies and non-departmental programs. **{Finance and Economic Development – May 17, 2018}**
7. To amend Ord. No. 2017-036, adopted May 15, 2017, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by re-appropriating a \$1,000,000.00 portion of the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 fund balance excess, assigned by Res. No. 2017-R080, adopted Nov. 6, 2017, to the General Fund Cash Transfer for Capital Projects program, and appropriated these transferred funds to the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Capital Budget by increasing estimated revenues by \$1,000,000.00 and the amount appropriated to the School Capital Maintenance project in the Education category by \$1,000,000.00, all for the purpose of abating lead in the water supply first and then other issues related to health and safety in public schools administered by the School Board of the City of Richmond, Virginia. **{Planning Commission – May 21, 2018}**
8. To name the basketball courts at the Pine Camp Cultural Arts and Community Center located at 4901 Old Brook Road as “The Tom Folliard Basketball Courts at Pine Camp.” **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – May 22, 2018}**
9. To amend and reordain ch. 14, art. V of the City Code by adding therein a new § 14-338, concerning notice of termination, for the purpose of terminating construction general permits from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality upon completion of construction projects, requiring notice to developers for insufficient notice of completion of construction projects, and conforming the section to the requirements of Va. Code § 62.1-44.15:26.1. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – May 22, 2018}**
10. To amend City Code § 29-189, concerning bus fares, for the purpose of authorizing a one-week period of free fares following the commencement of operations of the new Richmond Transit Network Plan and “Pulse” Bus Rapid Transit system. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – May 22, 2018}**
11. To amend section 21-5 of the City Code, concerning the public inspection of certain records, for the purpose of conforming the section to the requirements of Va. Code § 2.2-4343(A)(12). **{Governmental Operations – May 24, 2018}**
12. To reserve the easternmost southbound lane of North Belvidere Street on the north side of North Belvidere Street's intersection with West Broad Street for vehicular traffic making a left turn from southbound North Belvidere Street onto eastbound West Broad Street. (Ms. Gray) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – July 17, 2018}**

13. To amend and reordain City Code § 29-184, concerning the designation of bus stops for the motorbus system, for the purpose of prohibiting bus stops on North Davis Avenue. (Ms. Gray) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – July 17, 2018}**
14. To amend and reordain City Code § 29-172, concerning the designation of routes for motorbus systems, for the purpose of prohibiting certain operations of a motorbus system of passenger transportation in the block bounded by West Broad Street, North Robinson Street, West Grace Street, and North Davis Avenue. (Ms. Gray) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – July 17, 2018}**

15. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$27.16 from the Council District Funds for the Eighth District to reimburse Reva M. Trammell for a payment of \$27.16 for the cost of ice and bottled water that was served to attendees of the Eighth District Community Meeting held on April 19, 2018. No. 2013-R186-180, adopted Sept. 23, 2013, which requested that the Chief Administrative Officer cause all City departments and other agencies to incorporate into their budget requests for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 goals and initiatives designed to support the recommendations of the Mayor's Anti-Poverty Commission, as set forth in the Commission's report dated Jan. 18, 2013, for the purpose of making such request applicable to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 and each fiscal year thereafter. 22. To request that the Chief Administrative Officer cause to be prepared and submitted to the Council a report making recommendations for an appeals process for civil penalties imposed pursuant to City Code § 11-105. (Ms. Larson) **{Governmental Operations – May 24, 2018}**

To request that the Chief Administrative Officer annually cause to be conducted a review of dedicated funding strategies for Richmond Public Schools and provide the Council, the Mayor, and the School Board of the City of Richmond with recommendations concerning (i) the total budget appropriation for Richmond Public Schools for each ensuing fiscal year, (ii) funding sources for Richmond Public Schools, and (iii) any proposed changes to state legislation necessary to increase state funding to Richmond Public Schools.
