Whereas, Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, does hereby recognize Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church as it celebrates its 100th anniversary; and

Whereas, Founded on April 1, 1924, Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church was born out of historic Six Mount Zion Baptist Church, when 76 of its members requested a letter of independence and received consent to create another church; and

Whereas, Located at 913 N. 1st Street in the Jackson Ward Neighborhood of the Richmond Northside 3rd District, Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church is known for its community-based programing, mentoring, and service work on behalf of children, youth, young adults, and families, which include meals, tutorial, and literacy programs; and

Whereas, Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church initially began holding meetings at Richmond Public Schools - Armstrong High School, and, in 1926 its present site location was secured; and

Whereas, In 1926, Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church began holding meetings in the basement of the foundation of the new church that would be built, which continued there for many years; until the erection of a building structure at the location, in 1949; and

Whereas, Known for the dedication of its members, Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church has arown over the decades and its respected congregation has continued to provide and expand programs and services on behalf of its members and in response to the community;

Now, Therefore, Richmond City Council does hereby recognize Greater Mount Moriah Baptist Church as it celebrates its 100th anniversary, and brings this to the attention of all Richmond residents.
