Big Moves

- Lead by Example
- 2. City-wide Architectural Survey and Archaeological Assessment
- 3. Implement New Enabling Legislation to Conserve Historic Resources
- 4. Revise and Reinstate a More Inclusive Real Estate Tax Abatement Program for Rehabbed Properties, and Evaluate Tax Assessment Policies that Unintentionally Incentivize Demolition of Historic Resources
