EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$2,000 from the Council Districts Funds for the First District to provide funding to the Museum District Association to support community green initiatives, environmental improvements, tree planting, and maintenance of the median and triangle areas in the Museum District. (Mr. Addison)

MOTION TO AMEND

2. To amend Ord. No. 2017-071, which (i) repeals Ord. Nos. 89-202-180, adopted Jul. 10, 1989; 89-203-181, adopted Jul. 10, 1989; 94-156-147, adopted Jun. 27, 1994; 96-172-155, adopted Jun. 10, 1996; 98-200-251, adopted Jun. 22, 1998; and 2004-356-351, adopted Dec. 13, 2004; (ii) repeals art. III, §§ 26 and 31 of the pay plan adopted by Ord. No. 93-117-159, adopted May 24, 1993; and (iii) amends art. III of the pay plan adopted by Ord. No. 93-117-159, adopted May 24, 1993, by adding therein new §§ 26A (concerning reduction-in-force), 26B (concerning severance), and 26C (concerning amicable departure agreements), to replace references to “amicable departure agreement” with “separation agreement” and to modify certain provisions addressing the continuation of health benefits.

To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$3,540.00 from the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles, and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 General Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Office of Animal Care and Control by \$3,540.00 for the purpose of supporting sterilization programs for dogs and cats. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
4. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept grant funds in the amount of \$13,327.00 from the Local Initiatives Support Corporation, and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police by \$13,327.00 for the purpose of supporting the Department of Police’s Summer Midnight Basketball League program. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
5. To amend Ord. No. 2016-053, adopted May 13, 2016, which adopted a General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 and made appropriations pursuant thereto, to transfer funds in the amount of \$200,000.00 from the Department of Economic and Community Development agency and to appropriate this \$200,000.00 to the RRHA for East End Transformation line item in the Non-Departmental agency for the purpose of the acquisition and redevelopment of a property located at 1815 North 30th Street. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**

6. To amend Ord. No. 2016-048, adopted May 13, 2016, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Special Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by increasing estimated revenues from the dog and cat annual license program and the amount appropriated to the Office of Animal Care and Control's Pet License Collections special fund by \$30,000.00 to support expenditures pursuant to Va. Code § 3.2-6534. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
7. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to enter into the Tenth Extra Commercial Area Revitalization Effort Program Cooperation Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Economic Development Authority of the City of Richmond for the purpose of continuing the operation of the Extra Commercial Area Revitalization Effort ("Extra CARE") Program in the Belt Boulevard and the Upper Hull Street commercial corridors. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
8. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to enter into the Twenty-First Commercial Area Revitalization Effort Program Cooperation Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Economic Development Authority of the City of Richmond for the purpose of providing for the operation of the Commercial Area Revitalization Effort ("CARE") Program. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
9. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute the First Amendment to Grant Contract between the City of Richmond, Virginia, and the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority, to make a grant of \$500,000 to the Authority for the purpose of allowing additional time for the construction of a full-service grocery store at the intersection of North 25th Street and Nine Mile Road in the city of Richmond. **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
10. To create a new reservation of fund balance called the Cost of Living Adjustment Reserve intended to be categorized as a committed fund balance and used for cost of living adjustments for employees of the City of Richmond. (Mrs. Robertson) **{Finance and Economic Development – June 15, 2017}**
11. To provide for the granting by the City of Richmond to the person, firm or corporation to be ascertained in the manner prescribed by law of certain easements upon, over, under, and across certain property located in Monroe Park at 15 North Laurel Street for the construction, maintenance, and operation of electrical power transmission and distribution lines and associated appurtenances in accordance with a certain Right of Way Agreement. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – June 20, 2017}**
12. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Right of Entry License between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation, for the purpose of allowing the Virginia Department of

Transportation to access City-owned real estate located at 1800 Lakeside Avenue for the installation of handicapped accessible crosswalks and pedestrian traffic lights. (Ms. Gray) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – June 20, 2017}**

13. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Tenth Amendment to Management Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Richmond Metropolitan Transportation Authority, for the purpose of extending until Dec. 31, 2018, the Management Agreement for Main Street Station. **{Governmental Operations – June 22, 2017}**
14. To amend ch. 12, art. I of the City Code by adding therein new §§ 12-10.1, 12-11.1, 12-15.1, and 12-15.2 and to amend City Code §§ 12-11 and 12-12 for the purpose of prescribing the form of the Mayor’s annual budget submission and recommended budget amendments. (All Members of Council) **{Governmental Operations – June 22, 2017}**
15. To amend section 43 (Step-Based Pay System for Sworn Fire Fighters and Police Officers) of Article III of the pay plan adopted by Ord. No. 93-117-159 on May 24, 1993, for the purpose of providing for a step advancement for certain sworn fire and police personnel. **{Governmental Operations – June 22, 2017}**
16. To amend and reordain City Code § 2-1182, concerning the advertisement of unclassified job vacancies, for the purpose of aligning printed job advertisements with the City’s electronic application and recruitment process. **{Governmental Operations – June 22, 2017}**
17. To amend City Code § 2-728, concerning the Division of Emergency Communications, for the purpose of updating the Department’s functions; to amend and reordain ch. 2, art. IV, div. 19 of the City Code by adding therein a new § 2-729, concerning certain emergency communications agreements and fees, for the purpose of authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to enter into and modify certain agreements with external subscribers who use the City’s emergency communications systems; and to amend Appendix A of the City Code by adding therein for § 2-729(c) new fees applicable to subscribers who use the City’s emergency communications systems and for whom the Department installs, maintains, or repairs equipment in vehicles. **{Public Safety – June 27, 2017}**
18. To authorize Cellco Partnership, doing business as Verizon Wireless, to encroach upon the City of Richmond’s rights-of-way with cell antennas and related equipment to be mounted on designated utility poles approximately located at 5201 Patterson Avenue, in the alley behind 336 Lexington Road, in the alley behind 4601 Leonard Parkway, at 4700 Hanover Avenue, and at 3407 Floyd Avenue, respectively, upon certain terms and conditions. **{Planning Commission – July 17, 2017}**

19. To conditionally rezone the property known as 2213 East Franklin Street from the M-1 Light Industrial District to the B-5C Central Business District, upon certain proffered conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – July 17, 2017}**
20. To authorize the special use of the property known as 1717 East Cary Street for the purpose of allowing a building to exceed the applicable height restrictions, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – July 17, 2017}**
21. To adopt an amendment to the Master Plan for the City of Richmond, adopted by the City Planning Commission on Nov. 6, 2000, and by the City Council by Ord. No. 2000-371-2001-11, adopted Jan. 8, 2001, as previously amended, to incorporate the Pulse Corridor Plan, applicable to certain areas from the City’s corporate boundary on East Main Street to the intersection of East Main Street and North 14th Street and along East Broad Street to the City’s corporate boundary along Staples Mill Road, as part of the Master Plan. 22. To amend the Rules of Procedure adopted by Res. No. 2017-R001, adopted Jan. 3, 2017, as previously amended by Res. No. 2017-R013, adopted Mar. 27, 2017, and Res. No. 2017-R017, adopted Mar. 27, 2017, for the purpose of exempting ordinances making appropriations other than to the capital budget from the requirements for committee referral. 26. To impose enhanced speeding penalties pursuant to City Code § 27-163 and to authorize the placement of signs giving notice thereof on the portion of Hathaway Road located between Sequoyah Road and Wallowa Road and on the portion of Longview Drive

To express the City Council’s support for House Bill 922 and Senate Bill 1156, currently pending in the United States Congress, in the belief that such legislation could be used to increase private investment in the rehabilitation of public school buildings for the benefit of schoolchildren in the city.
