PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute a grant contract between the City of Richmond and Challenge Discovery Projects, Inc. for the purpose of providing social and emotional wellness services as part of the We Matter RVA youth gun violence prevention program

REASON: An ordinance is required to authorize the CAO to sign the grant contract on behalf of the City

RECOMMENDATION: Approval is recommended by City Administration

BACKGROUND: In 2021, the City of Richmond won a \$500,000 Gun Violence Intervention Program grant from the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services for the purpose of launching a new community-based prevention program, named "We Matter RVA". We Matter is coordinated collaboratively by the Office of Children and Families and the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities, and engages ChildSavers, Challenge Discovery Projects

and Communities in Schools to support students who meet specific criteria that reflect the Center for Disease Control's indicated risk factors for youth violence. The program serves students at River City and Martin Luther King, Jr. Middle Schools, and provides positive youth development opportunities (including recreation, mentorship and non-clinical but therapeutic sessions with mental health providers) and a financial incentive, to children who have either witnessed gun violence firsthand or who have family members who have perpetrated gun violence. We Matter supports participants as they build CDC-defined protective factors so that they are less likely to engage in violent activity or perpetrate gun violence. Ordinance Number 2021-269, approved in October 2021, authorized the acceptance of the grant funds from DCJS.

The 2021 DCJS grant continues to cover costs of the program for the second year of the first class of participants, who are now in 8th grade.

Based on the successes of the first class of participants, the strong positive feedback from participants and their families, and the incredible potential of this program, the City of Richmond intends to continue to operate We Matter for a second class of participants at River City and MLK Middle Schools. The program will kick off in January 2023, enrolling 10 7th graders at each middle school who will be invited to continue their participation until the end of their 8th grade year. This Challenge Discovery Projects grant will cover costs associated with mental, behavioral and socio-emotional supports for participants at MLK Middle School, from January through August 2023. The City's Fiscal Year 2023 budget includes funding to the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities for their portion of the program.

WE MATTER RVA GRANT CONTRACT

THIS GRANT CONTRACT is made this day of, 2022 between the City of
Richmond, a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia
(the "City") and Challenge Discovery Projects, Inc., a Virginia non-stock corporation, authorized
to transact business in the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "Recipient").

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

- A. Section 15.2-953(A) Code of Virginia authorizes the City to make gifts and donations to any charitable institution or association, located within their respective limits or outside their limits if such institutions or association provides services to residents of the locality.
- B. By Ordinance No. 2022-055 the City Council of the City of Richmond, Virginia, adopted the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2022 and ending July 30, 2023 and appropriated funds in the amount of \$500,000 to the "Reserve for Children's Fund" ("Children's Fund") in the Non-Departmental agency.
- C. Ordinance No. <INSERT ORDINANCE NUMBER> adopted <INSERT DATE OF ADOPTION> further authorizes the City to enter into this Grant Contract providing funds in the amount of \$80,000 ("Grant Funds") from the Children's Fund for the purposes set forth herein to support the implementation of We Matter RVA, a gun violence prevention program ("Program") for Richmond middle school students.

The City and the Recipient, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

C. Any party may change the contact information set forth in this section by submitting a written statement that the party is making such a change and setting forth the contact information of the party's new point of contact to the other parties' points of contact.

2. Payment of Grant Funds.

- A. Payments of the Grant Funds to the Recipient shall be made in one lump sum as soon as practicable following full execution of this Contract.
- B. The Recipient shall return to the City all of the Grant Funds received by the Recipient if the requirements set forth in Section 3 below are not fulfilled.
- 3. **Scope of Services**. In consideration of the City's grant of the Grant Funds to the Recipient, the Recipient shall:
 - (A) Support one cohort at Martin Luther King Jr. Middle School composed of participants identified and recruited for the Program. An eligible participant will be a 7th or 8th grader who has not committed violent acts but has either experienced gun violence firsthand or who has siblings who have committed gun violence.
 - (B) Provide a mental and behavioral health professional to support participants.
 - (C) In accordance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations and with any necessary consents, share relevant participant information with Program providers.
- 4. **Performance Measures**. The City will use the following performance measure to evaluate whether the Recipient has performed the services required by this Contract in a manner that achieves the City's purpose in providing the Grant Funds to the Recipient:

Did the Recipient:

(A) Support one cohort at Martin Luther King Jr. Middle School composed of participants identified and recruited for the Program?

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- (B) Provide a mental and behavioral health professional to support participants?
- (C) In accordance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations and with any necessary consents, share relevant participant information with afterschool Program providers?
- 5. Reporting. Recipient shall collect the data necessary for reporting and compliance monitoring pursuant to this Contract. The Recipient shall furnish the City's point of contact with a written report on the use of the Grant Funds upon the expenditure of all of the Grant Funds.
- 6. Acknowledgement of Donation. The Recipient shall, in connection with any programs, events, or other matters funded in whole or in part with the Grant Funds, acknowledge the City of Richmond as a donor, contributor, or sponsor. This acknowledgement must be included on any promotional materials, brochures, publications, websites, or other visible locations. The City has the right, upon request, to review and approve any such acknowledgement. Further, the City has the right, in its sole discretion, to require the removal of its name from any such promotional materials, brochures, publications, websites, or other visible locations.
- 7. Compliance Monitoring. The City's point of contact shall monitor the Recipient's compliance with this Contract. In addition to the reports required by Section 5, the Recipient shall furnish the City's point of contact with any information reasonably requested by the City's point of contact in order to enable the City's point of contact to determine whether the Recipient is meeting or has met the performance measures set forth in this Contract.
- 8. Recipient's Representations and Warranties. The Recipient represents and warrants as follows:
 - A. The Recipient is and will be for the duration of this Contract a charitable institution or association as detailed in Section 15.2-953(A) of the Code of Virginia.
 - B. The Recipient's signatory below is duly authorized by the Recipient to enter into this Contract and thereby bind the Recipient to this Contract's terms and conditions. This Grant Contract is signed when a party's signature is delivered by facsimile, email, or other electronic medium. These signatures must be treated in all respects as having the same force and effect as original signatures.
 - C. The Recipient possesses a lease, license, memorandum of understanding, or other contract or legal right allowing Recipient's use of space at Martin Luther King, Jr. Middle School or any community center owned or operated by the School Board of the City of Richmond, Virginia for the purposes of this Contract.

9. Audit. Pursuant to Section 2-187 of the Code of the City of Richmond, the Recipient shall, as a condition of receiving monies from the City, be subject to periodic audits of its finances and expenditures of such City monies by the City Auditor on demand and without notice.
