

PURPOSE: To update Gas and Wastewater Utility rates in Appendix A of City Code that were omitted from previously approved rate ordinances, Ord. No. 2019-068 (Gas Utility) and Ord. No. 2019-070 (Wastewater Utility).

REASON: Budgeted revenues and expenses included these rate increases but were erroneously omitted from rate ordinances. Projected Gas and Wastewater revenues will not be achieved without the inclusion of these rates. These rates were included in the customer impact percentages previously provided to the Administration and City Council.

RECOMMENDATION: Authorize rate approvals by amending Appendix A.
