

AN ORDINANCE NO. 87-76-101

ADOPTED MAY 28 1987

To repeal Sections 9-341, 9-342, 9-343, and 9-344, of the Code of the City of Richmond, 1985, concerning fees for entry to Bryan Park.

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That Sections 9-341, 9-342, 9-343, and 9-344 of the Code of the City of Richmond, 1985, as follows, be and are hereby repealed:

Sec. 9-341. Entry of vehicles during azalea blossom period.

For the privilege of entering Bryan Park during the three-week azalea blossom period (normally such period commences on or after March fifteenth and terminates on or before April thirtieth, depending upon weather conditions, but the actual period shall be determined by, and shall be fixed by, directive of the director of recreation and parks) there shall be imposed upon and collected from the operator of each vehicle a fee of fifty cents (\$0.50).

Sec. 9-342. Entry fee on weekdays, Monday through through Friday, excluding holidays.

For the privilege of entering Bryan Park during

the period commencing April first and continuing through September thirtieth of each year, with the exclusion of the three-week azalea blossom period (see section 9-341), on any weekday, Monday through Friday, with the exclusion of holidays falling on any of said days, there shall be imposed upon and collected from the operator of each vehicle a fee of one dollar (\$1.00).

Sec. 9-434. Entry fee on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

For the privilege of entering Bryan Park during the period commencing April first and continuing through September thirtieth of each year, with the exclusion of the three-week azalea blossom period (see section 9-341), on any Saturday, Sunday or holiday, there shall be imposed upon and collected from the operator of each vehicle a fee of two dollars (\$2.00).

Sec. 9-344. Exemption from payment of fees.

(a) Vehicles displaying a current city registration decal, county residents (and guests of such county residents) whose only means of access to their residences is by way of and through Bryan Park, and all persons holding licenses from the city for the operation of concessions in Bryan Park, persons certified as employees of such licensees, and vehicles operated by such licensees or employees shall be exempted from the payment of the fees imposed in sections 9-341, 9-342 and 9-343.

(b) The director of recreation and parks, pursuant to the permissive provisions of section 16.02 of the Charter may, in his judgment, from time to time, when conditions warrant, waive imposition of, and collection of, the fees provided for in sections 9-341, 9-342 and 9-343.

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect July 1, 1987.
