I have photographic evidence that contradicts the city staff account of the removal of "dead" trees from Monroe Park. I am writing to request a full independent investigation of the tragic destruction of healthy mature trees in Monroe Park, and to request a full independent investigation of whether city staff and the Monroe Park Conservancy conspired in a cover-up of the unauthorized tree removal.

Not counting the huge loss of the trees' natural and aesthetic importance, the monetary value of the 14 destroyed trees exceeds tens-of-thousands of dollars. The Monroe Park Conservancy and city staff must be held accountable for the unauthorized removal of these mature healthy trees from our city park, and new trees must be planted to replace the 14 trees that were removed without authorization as soon as possible.

A meeting was held to discuss the issue on January 13, 2017, and in attendance were City Council aide Amy Robins, Capital Projects Manager Donald Summers, Urban Forestry Operations Manager John Chupek, Dept. of Public Works Public Information Manager Sharon North, City Arborist Alexander Elton, former Monroe Park Advisory Council Member Todd Woodson, and myself. At this meeting, Donald Summers acknowledged that 7 healthy trees were removed without authorization and without the proper permits for the unsubstantiated reason that these 7 trees allegedly were somehow in conflict with a "bio-retention" plan.

According to additional testimony, City Arborist Alexander Elton testified that on December 12, 2016 in Monroe Park, in company with representatives of the Monroe Park Conservancy, he identified and marked 7 "dead" trees for removal. Elton could provide no documentation or notes for these decisions. These trees were later identified on a revised "Tree Demolition Plan" dated 12/12/16. In an e-mail that Councilman Agelasto forwarded to me, Donald Summers wrote, "*The 12/12/16 plan is the amended plan after the walk through with the City Arborist, City Annual Tree Contractor, 3 North designers, MP Conservancy (Alice Massie) and the City PM* [Project Manager]."

But the testimony of City Arborist Elton and the account of Donald Summers that the 7 "dead" trees were identified for removal on December 12, 2016 is in direct conflict with my photographic evidence. I photographed the removal of a healthy tree with full canopy that was identified as being one of the 7 "dead" trees marked on the 12/12/16 "Tree Demolition Plan." Moreover, I photographed the removal of the healthy tree on December 5, 2016, a full week before the walk-through on December 12, 2016, when City Arborist Elton alleged that he marked the 7 "dead" trees for removal. (See Attachment 1.) I made a point of photographing the dismantling of the tree in Monroe Park because I was very upset that such a notable, large, healthy tree was being removed from our city park. The date and time that this photograph was taken was preserved with the cell-phone information: I have attached a copy of the date and time information that documents that my photograph of the healthy tree removal was taken at 12:38 p.m. on December 5, 2016. (See Attachment 2.)

The healthy tree that I photographed being removed on 12/5/16 is identified on the 12/12/16 "Tree Demolition Plan" as one of the 7 "dead" trees that allegedly were marked by City Arborist Elton for removal on his walk-through on 12/12/16. (See Attachment 3.) How did City Arborist Elton mark this tree as "dead" on the walk-through on 12/12/16 when the healthy tree had been removed a week earlier?

The assertion of the City Arborist there were 7 "dead" mature trees in the park also is in direct conflict with the testimony of former Monroe Park Advisory Council Member Todd Woodson, who testified at the January 13, 2017 meeting that he observed no dead mature trees in the park on his very frequent visits to the park. The removal of these 14 trees was not supported by the Monroe Park Master Plan.

Clearly an investigation is warranted to determine if these trees were removed to advance another agenda of the Monroe Park Conservancy. An independent investigation by law enforcement is warranted to determine if city staff and the Monroe Park Conservancy conspired to falsely assert that 7 of the trees were "dead," as part of a cover-up of the unauthorized destruction of these city trees.

Additionally, this tragic destruction of Monroe Park's mature tree canopy points out the need to re-establish the Monroe Park Advisory Board with neighborhood participation and to immediately broaden the Monroe Park Conservancy board to include citizen input from the adjacent neighborhoods. Monroe Park belongs to the citizens of Richmond, and the citizens' interests are not being represented under the Conservancy. The 14 trees that were removed without authorization should be replaced immediately, just as other damaged park property is replaced. It is alarming that there is no plan to replace these trees; the existing plan that specifies replanting trees is insufficient.

Councilman Agelasto, thank you very much for your leadership on this issue.



However, my photograph in Attachment 1. shows the healthy tree with full canopy (which I identify with a red square on the map) being dismantled on 12/5/16, a full week before the walk-through by the City Arborist.
