

§ 1. That Ordinance No. 2022-055, adopted May 9, 2022, which adopted a General Fund Budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, and made appropriations pursuant thereto, is hereby amended by transferring funds in the amount of \$204,199.00 from the Non-Departmental agency, Reserve for Civilian Review Board line item and appropriating such transferred funds in the amount of \$204,199.00 to the City Council agency, for the purpose of providing funds to establish a Civilian Review Board.

RE: Transfer of Funds for Implementation of Civilian Review Board

PURPOSE: To transfer \$204,199 from an administrative non-departmental reserve (SECTION 4-169 of the [FY23 adopted budget](#)) to the Richmond City Council's operating budget for the purpose of establishing a Civilian Review Board (CRB).

REASON: On October 10, 2022, the Richmond City Council approved ORD. 2022-261, which established Richmond's first Civilian Review Board. In order to hire a new FTE to manage the CRB and provide funding for the future operation of the CRB, \$204,199 must be transferred to the Richmond City Council as they are the primary oversight body for the CRB.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval is recommended by the City Administration.

BACKGROUND:

On September 12, 2022 Mayor Stoney and Councilmembers Jones, Lynch, Addison, and Lambert introduced [Ordinance No. 2022-261](#). This ordinance, which was unanimously approved by City Council on October 10, 2022, established an 8-person Civilian Review Board (CRB), empowered to review the Richmond Police Department's (RPD) internal investigations of the most serious cases and all citizen appeals of RPD internal investigations. The CRB will be independent of the Police Department, and have the right to request subpoenas and hire outside investigators.
