MOTIONS TO AMEND

1. To amend Ord. No. 2019-294, which closes, to public use and travel, a portion of Greenville Avenue between its southern terminus and Kansas Avenue and a portion of a 16' alley located in the adjacent block to the east of Greenville Avenue and bounded by Kansas Avenue to the north and Carter Street to the east, together consisting of 22,760± square feet, and to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept the dedication of a 500 square foot right-of-way area for a turnaround near the proposed new southern terminus of the alley, all for the purpose of facilitating redevelopment of the area, upon certain terms and conditions, to modify the amount of the applicant's payment for the closure.
2. To amend Ord. No. 2019-302, which authorizes the special use of the property known as 1620 Park Avenue for the purpose of a multifamily dwelling, upon certain terms and conditions, to provide for revised plans.
3. To amend Ord. No. 2020-011, which authorizes the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute appropriate documents releasing the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority and its successors in interest from the reversionary right of the City contained in a certain quit claim deed concerning the properties known as 1116 North 31st Street and 1501 North 31st Street for the purpose of allowing the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority to develop the properties as single-family residential units offered for sale to the public and to ensure that eight such parcels be developed as single-family affordable housing units offered for sale to qualified purchasers, to more accurately identify the properties or portions of properties involved in the project.

ORDINANCES

4. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$375,000.00 from the United States Department of Justice; to amend the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Commonwealth's Attorney called the Commonwealth's Attorney's FY 2020 Elder Abuse Prevention Special Budget Fund; and to appropriate the grant funds received to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Commonwealth's Attorney's FY 2020 Elder Abuse Prevention Special Budget Fund by \$375,000.00 for the purpose of reducing elder abuse in the city of Richmond. {No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}

5. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$15,720.80 from the Virginia Department of Health, Office of Emergency Medical Services, and to appropriate the grant funds received to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services' Four for Life Program Special Fund by \$15,720.80 for the purpose of supporting West End Volunteer Rescue Squad, Inc. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
6. To provide for the granting by the City of Richmond to the person, firm or corporation to be ascertained in the manner prescribed by law of certain easements upon, over, under, and across certain property located at 3301 Maplewood Avenue for the construction, installation, operation, maintenance, inspection, repair, replacement, and removal of telecommunications lines and associated appurtenances in accordance with a certain Right of Way Agreement. **{Land Use, Housing, and Transportation – February 18, 2020}**
7. To amend Ord. No. 2019-084, adopted Apr. 8, 2019, which declared that a public necessity exists and to authorize the acquisition of certain fee simple interests and easements for the public purpose of constructing multimodal transportation and drainage improvements along Hull Street Road between its intersection with Hey Road and its intersection with Warwick Road, to authorize the acquisition of additional fee simple and easement interests for the project. **{Planning Commission – February 18, 2020}**
8. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 2017-129, adopted Oct. 9, 2017, which authorized the special use of the property known as 1704 Arlington Road for the purpose of illuminated canopy signage, to modify the permitted uses, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – March 2, 2020}**
9. To authorize the special use of the property known as 1111 North 32nd Street for the purpose of a two-family detached dwelling, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – March 2, 2020}**
10. To authorize the special use of the property known as 1320 North 31st Street for the purpose of two single-family attached dwellings, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – March 2, 2020}**
11. To authorize the special use of the property known as 5616 Kendall Road for the purpose of two single-family detached dwellings, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – March 2, 2020}**

12. To approve an expenditure in the amount of \$1,000.00 from the Council District Funds for the Second District to make a donation to CodeVA, Inc., to support outdoor art galleries at various locations on Broad Street between North 3rd Street and Foushee Street for the display of art work in March and April, 2020, by students of Richmond Public Schools and children in the City's juvenile justice system. 13. To express the City Council's support for and request the Commonwealth Transportation Board to provide funding for the City's SMART SCALE candidate projects for 2020. **{Land Use, Housing, and Transportation – February 18, 2020}**

To request that the Mayor propose a Fiscal Year 2020-2021 General Fund Budget that provides for an appropriation to the Office of Animal Care and Control to provide for two new animal control officer positions for the purpose of improving the enforcement of City Code § 4-243, concerning the prohibition against dogs running at large and the penalty therefor. (Mrs. Robertson) **{Governmental Operations – February 27, 2020}**

15. To request that the Mayor propose a Fiscal Year 2020-2021 General Fund Budget that provides for an appropriation of \$221,770.00 for a third-party equity analysis to measure equity in the City and that further provides for equity training for a core group of City employees and appointed and elected officials for the purpose of eliminating inequities through improved City policy.
