

I am writing to express my concerns about the proposed Richmond Animal Care and Control (RACC) Adoption Center at 2310 W. Cary Street and 2311 Herbert Hamlet Alley. As a resident of 2318 Herbert Hamlet Alley, I am directly impacted by this proposed development.

While I support the mission of RACC, I believe that the proposed location is fundamentally unsuitable for several reasons:

1. Incompatible Zoning:

- The proposed site is located within a residential neighborhood, not a commercial or industrial zone.
- An animal adoption center, with its inherent noise, traffic, and potential odors, is incompatible with the residential area.

2. Parking and Traffic Congestion:

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Dear Members of the City Council,

I'm writing to submit a formal public comment *against* the proposed purchase of the property at 2310 W. Cary St. and the establishment of the Richmond Animal Care and Control Adoption center at this location.

As a resident and property owner at 2318 Herbert Hamlet Aly, my condo faces directly the aforementioned property. I am concerned about the noise pollution this center will create. RACC director Christie Peters said they do not expect noise to be an issue, given the structural integrity of the shelter; however, this building does not even have properly insulated double-glass windows. Instead, the windows in the back of the property feature simple polycarbonate windows.

Christie Peters also mentioned that the shelter would have its own dumpster which would be placed in Herbert Hamlet Aly, and it would be emptied 3-4 times per week. I am concerned that this would create an unnecessary traffic in the alley with garbage trucks trying to maneuver multiple times a week. The entrance to our building is directly through the alley, and we already suffer from high-speed traffic passing through.

According to Christie Peters, the shelter would not have any designated off-street parking, although they expect this location to be an adoption center with a significant volume of customer traffic. Unfortunately, they could not answer the question regarding my concern how the RACC will control that its customers will not park their vehicles in our parking lot behind the adoption center. Their response was to simply call the towing company.

Finally, beyond these personal concerns, I think that the City should be spending its funds for the benefit of its human inhabitants. While I appreciate the important work of the RACC (me and my partner fostered cats in the past, and we currently live with our rescued fury friend), the people in this city are in desperate need of more crucial projects. During the meeting the Christie Peters held, they mentioned that the funds reserved for the purchase of this property need to be used only for infrastructure related projects. I'm sure as you all are aware such funds would be better spent, for example, to improve the condition of Richmond public schools, to provide more shelter space for the unhoused folks, or to establish a safe harbor for survivors of domestic violence, sexual violence, and human trafficking. There are many more examples one could add to this list which would improve the lives of the people of Richmond.



I was told to email this address to make a public comment about the issue in the subject line. So here goes:

First, let me say that I have adopted several pets from shelters and adopted others that were abandoned by hunters, etc. Our family has two shelter beagles now, and we have always had pets at the homes we owned. We have supported several humane societies and shelters over the years financially. Pets are incredibly important members of our family. I would like nothing more than to see a wonderful, bustling facility with happy pets going to their forever homes.

However, I and others in the neighborhood are still concerned about the noise and traffic this new facility might create. Is there any way a study can be done to estimate decibel levels and the amount of traffic that will come with the new use of the building?

Also, as I understand it, this center is being put here for better retail exposure. Is there any proof that this will increase adoption rates? Is there a comparable example to review (in another city or location) with pre and post move adoption numbers?

After Covid I know that the shelters were full of pets adopted during Covid. People discarded them because they didn't think through the commitment that comes with caring for a pet or their remote work policies were revoked. I wonder if making it too easy also makes for less responsible adoptions? Are there studies or numbers that show that where an adoption center is located drives forever adoption rates?

It would be good to have some real-world information to back this concept up.
