Richmond City Councilmembers utilize the Council Action Request (CAR) process to effectively and efficiently navigate the legislative process, seek research assistance, and a number of other functions. This brief report serves as a quarterly update for individual Councilmembers on the status of their CAR submissions.

Quarterly CAR Submissions

Eight CAR submissions were sent to the Office of Council Chief of Staff (OCCoS) by the First District during the fourth quarter (April-June) of the 2024 fiscal year. Four submissions were categorized as request for new legislation and the remaining four were requests for research and legislative analysis.


