## MOTION TO AMEND

1. To amend Ord. No. 2024-015, which authorizes the special use of the properties known as 1200, 1202, 1204, 1206, 1208, 1210, 1212, and 1220 North 26<sup>th</sup> Street for the purpose of ten single-family attached dwellings and ten garages as an accessory use, upon certain terms and conditions, to provide for revised plans and terms and conditions.

## ORDINANCES

2. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a License Agreement between the Capital Region Land Conservancy, Inc., as licensor, and the City of Richmond, as licensee, for the purpose of granting the City of Richmond access to the portion of the Richmond Slave Trail located on the property known as 1401 Brander Street in the city of Richmond to make certain improvements. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 19, 2024}**
3. To erect all-way stop signs at the intersection of Grayland Avenue and South Sheppard Street. (Ms. Lynch) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 19, 2024}**
4. To erect all-way stop signs at the intersection of Parkwood Avenue and McCloy Street (Ms. Lynch) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 19, 2024}**
5. To designate that portion of East 32nd Street located between its intersection with Midlothian Turnpike and its intersection with McRand Street in honor of the late Frank J. Wilkins, Sr. (Ms. Lynch) **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 19, 2024}**
6. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the total amount of \$3,000,000.00 from the Central Virginia Transportation Authority, and to amend Ord. No. 2023-073, adopted May 8, 2023, which accepted a program of proposed Capital Improvement Projects for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and the four fiscal years thereafter, adopted a Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, and determined a means of financing the same, by (i) establishing a new project for the Department of Public Works in the Transportation category called the “Fall Line Trail Bryan Park Segment” project, and (ii) increasing estimated revenues from the funds received from the Central Virginia Transportation Authority and the amount appropriated to the new Department of Public Works’ Fall Line Trail Bryan Park Segment project in the Transportation category by \$3,000,000.00, for the

purpose of funding the implementation of the Fall Line Trail Bryan Park Segment project. **{Planning Commission – March 19, 2024 and Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**

7. To amend Ord. No. 2023-071, adopted May 8, 2023, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by increasing revenues from estimated interest income by \$9,000,000.00, to appropriate a portion of such estimated interest income to various City departments and a non-departmental agency, to create certain new line items in the Non-departmental agency, appropriate a portion of such estimated interest income revenue thereto, and transfer certain funds; to amend Ord. No. 2023-073, adopted May 8, 2024, which accepted a program of proposed Capital Improvement Projects for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and the four fiscal years thereafter, adopted a Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, and determined a means of financing the same, by establishing a new project for the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Community Facilities in the Capital Investment Opportunities category called the “Parks Improvement Projects” project; and to appropriate \$988,156.00 in transferred funds of such \$9,000,000.00 of increased revenue from estimated interest income to the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Community Facilities’ Parks Improvement Projects project in the Capital Investment Opportunities category for the purpose of funding improvements in City parks and recreation facilities. **{Planning Commission – March 19, 2024 and Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
8. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the amount of \$8,312.28 from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Public Works’ Litter Control Act Grant Special Fund by \$8,312.28 for the purpose of supporting the City’s litter prevention and recycling activities. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
9. To amend Ord. No. 2023-071, adopted May 8, 2023, as amended by Ord. No. 2023-273, adopted Oct. 10, 2023, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, by changing the uses and allocation of the Council District Funds for the Ninth District pursuant to Va. Code § 15.2-2503 for the use of the Council Member in the representation of the Ninth District. (Ms. Jones) **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
10. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the amount of \$50,000.00 from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management, to amend the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response called the “FY24 Mobile Camera Trailer Grant Special Fund,” and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response’s FY24

Mobile Camera Trailer Grant Special Fund by \$50,000.00, for the purpose purchasing a mobile camera trailer. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**

11. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the amount of \$249,000.00 from the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services, to amend the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Office of the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Human Services called the OIRE Youth and Family Violence Prevention Special Fund, and to appropriate \$88,750.00 of the accepted funds to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Office of the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Human Services' OIRE Youth and Family Violence Prevention Special Fund by \$88,750.00, and to amend the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 General Fund by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the YWCA Richmond line item in the Non-Departmental agency by the remaining \$160,250.00 of the accepted funds, all for the purpose of providing violence prevention and intervention services to newcomer, immigrant, and refugee youth. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
12. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the amount of \$249,976.00 from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management, to amend the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response called the "FY24 Vehicle Barrier System Grant Special Fund," and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response's FY24 Vehicle Barrier System Grant Special Fund by \$249,976.00, for the purpose purchasing a vehicle barrier system. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
13. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the amount of \$300,000.00 from the Virginia 9-1-1 Services Board, to amend the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by creating a new special fund for the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response called the "FY24 Call Handling Equipment Grant Special Fund," and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response's FY24 Call Handling Equipment Grant Special Fund by \$300,000.00, for the purpose of updating the call handling equipment within the City's emergency communication center. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
14. To amend Ord. No. 2023-071, adopted May 8, 2023, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Special Fund Budget, by increasing estimated revenues from the Downtown Special Assessment Fund and Riverfront Special Assessment Fund by \$613,714.32 and appropriating such increases to the Department of Finance's Special Assessment

Districts Special Fund and Riverfront Special Assessment Special Fund for the purpose of funding Venture Richmond services. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**

15. To amend Ord. No. 2023-071, adopted May 8, 2023, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, to (i) create certain new line items in the Non-Departmental agency, (ii) transfer \$830,485.00 from the Office of Sustainability, and (iii) appropriate such \$830,485.00 to the new line items in the Non-Departmental agency, all for the purpose of providing grants to certain entities to facilitate the implementation of neighborhood climate resilience projects. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
16. To amend City Code § 26-298, concerning interest on refunds of tax payments, for the purpose of requiring the Department of Finance to notify taxpayers of admissions, lodging, and meals taxes and business, professional and occupational license taxes of any credits or overpayments on their accounts and invite the taxpayer to apply for a refund within 90 days of the credit becoming available. (Ms. Lynch, President Nye, Mayor Stoney, and Vice President Lambert) **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
17. To amend City Code § 26-361, concerning the due date, payment without penalty, and interest chargeable on delinquent taxes, 26-362, concerning the due date when assessed by the State Corporation Commission, penalty, and rates of interest chargeable on delinquent taxes, and 26-430, concerning the penalty for delinquent taxes, for the purpose of requiring the Department of Finance to send to taxpayers assessed with taxes and levies for that year by United States mail a bill setting forth the amount due not later than 45 days prior to the payment due date for such taxes and levies. (Ms. Lynch) **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
18. To amend and reordain City Code §§ 26-364, concerning tax relief for elderly persons, and evaluation of exemption or freeze program, and 26-365, concerning real estate tax relief for qualified permanently and totally disabled, and evaluation of exemption or freeze program, for the purpose of revising certain exemptions and deadlines. (Ms. Lynch) **{Finance and Economic Development – March 21, 2024}**
19. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 2019-300, adopted Nov. 12, 2019, which authorized the special use of the property known as 1217 West Leigh Street for the purpose of a veterinary clinic, to expand the veterinary use and to revise the plans, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
20. To authorize the special use of the property known as 1205 North 34th Street for the purpose of two single-family attached dwellings, certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
21. To authorize the special use of the property known as 2727 West Broad Street for the

purpose of a restaurant use with a nightclub that is open until 2:00 a.m., upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**

22. To authorize the special use of the property known as 5224 Bryce Lane for the purpose of a day nursery for up to 12 children, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
23. To authorize the special use of the property known as 2127 Idlewood Avenue for the purpose of a dwelling unit within an accessory building to a single-family attached dwelling, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
24. To authorize the special use of the property known as 3001 West Leigh Street for the purpose of a mixed-use building with outdoor dining, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
25. To authorize the special use of the property known as 2430 Rucker Lane for the purpose of up to two single-family detached dwellings, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 2, 2024}**
