## Call to Order

Denise Rimes, First Unitarian Universalist Church member, Richmonders Involved to Strengthen our Communities (RISC) team leader, requested that all proposed affordable housing funds be allocated to the city's Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Beverly Ross, Sacred Heart Catholic Church South Richmond member, RISC team leader, requested that the Council include two million dollars in the city's proposed budget to address mobile home repair in the city.

Paulina Chavez stated her appreciation for the city's previous and future assistance to address mobile home repair.

Marvin Gilliam, Mount Carmel Baptist Church Pastor, RISC Co-President, requested that the city's Affordable Housing Trust Fund and the city's Mobile Home and Replacement Program be adequately funded.

Sharon Gilbert, RPS Administrative Office Associate, REA member, requested that Council fully fund the RPS proposed budget.

Ann Forrester, RPS Teacher, REA Vice President, requested that Council amend the proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 budget to fully fund the RPS proposed budget. Ms. Forrester requested that Council redirect funding from the Richmond Police Department (RPD) to RPS.

Gail Freeman-Hull, RPS Administrative Office Associate, REA member, addressed collective bargaining, and she requested that Council fully fund RPS.

Lynne Fetter stated her concerns about the condition of RPS facilities, and she requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request.

Ansley Perkins informed Council about the potential budget cuts RPS would make if Council does not amend the budget to fully fund the RPS budget request.

LaKesha Williams, RPS Teacher, addressed RPS facilities, and she requested that the city fully fund the RPS budget request.

Charles Willis, United Communities Against Crime Executive Director, requested that Council amend the proposed FY 2025 budget to fund the Trauma Healing Response network.

Omar Kenyatta stated his concerns about violence and poverty in the city. Mr. Kenyatta requested that Council work with the Virginia General Assembly and federal government to address violence and education in the city.

Sean Cassar, Richmond Chapter of the Democratic Socialist of America member, requested that proposed funding for capital improvement projects be reallocated to RPS.

Madeline McElgunn requested that Council amend the FY 2025 budget to fully fund the RPS budget request by reallocating funds from RPD.

Samantha Mladen informed Council about her experience providing clinical care to city residents within burn and fire recovery facilities. Ms. Mladen requested that the city fund proactive safety measures in RPS facilities to protect residents.

Allan Chipman requested that the city not prioritize the development of a new baseball stadium and instead fully fund the RPS budget request.

Jacob Neal-Helt, RPS Teacher, requested that Council amend the budget to fully fund the RPS budget request. Mr. Neal-Helt stated that a fully funded RPS budget would benefit the overall quality of life of residents.

Kayla Aaron, RPS Teacher, REA member, addressed her concerns about the quality of RPS facilities, and she requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request.

Jasmine Cuellar requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget by reallocating funding from RPD.

Lisa Delao, RPS Teacher, REA board member, stated that Council should show the importance of the city's youth by fully funding the RPS proposed budget.

Roslyn Anderson, RPS Cafeteria Manager, REA board member, stated her concerns about the quality of RPS facilities, and she requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request.

David Baker, RPS Teacher, stated his concerns about RPS facilities and the impact on RPS students. Mr. Baker requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request.

Kayla Temple stated that she was a RPS graduate, and she requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request by reallocating funds from capital improvement projects and RPD.

Mac Atkins requested that Council fully fund the RPS budget request by reallocating funds from RPD.

Sarah Mattingly noted her support for Council amending the budget to provide funding for affordable housing, and she requested that Council also fully fund the RPS budget request.

Councilor Stephanie Lynch stated her appreciation for individuals that provided comments regarding the proposed FY 2025 budget. Councilor Lynch also stated that Council would work to fund the difference between the mayor's proposed FY 2025 budget and the RPS budget request.
