

City of Richmond 2024 Session Report: Sine Die March 10, 2024

The details of the budget conference committee's report were released on Thursday late afternoon which allowed for a Saturday afternoon consideration and vote on the budget by the General Assembly. Immediately following its release on Thursday, Governor Youngkin held a press conference at the steps of the Capitol voicing his displeasure that Democrats in the legislature had declined to move forward on his Alexandria arena project proposal, essentially killing the project for the moment. It is highly unusual for a Governor to hold a press conference on the day the legislature releases its conference report, and some have called it a departure from "the Virginia Way." Governor Youngkin mostly placed the blame primarily at the feet of the Senate Finance and Appropriations Committee and its Chair Senator L. Louise Lucas, accusing them of wrongly blocking a projected economic windfall.

Senators Lucas and Locke watched from the top of the Capitol steps well above the Governor, surely in a symbolic reminder of the power of the legislature. Given her proximity to the press conference, many reporters rushed over to her to capture her in-the-moment response rather than hang around the Governor's staff. Senator Lucas proudly took credit for the defeat, stating that she did not feel it was appropriate to place the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth behind a potential sports team arena project stadium project which its billionaire owner could fund himself.

- **Included**: Aid to local police departments (was in the Senate budget)
- **Not included**: \$150m for Virginia Technology Infrastructure Fund for technology updates
- Not included: Additional funding for the Coastal Storm Risk Management Project
- Not Included: Additional funding for business-ready sites.
- **Not included:** Moving the ABC from the Public Safety and Homeland Security Secretariat to an independent agency

The House and the Senate convened on Saturday to adopt the conference committee report, which will then be enrolled and sent to Governor Youngkin. The budget conference report passed both the House and Senate with bipartisan support, 62 yes - 37 no in the House and 24 yes - 14 no in the Senate.

While the conference committee report cannot be amended and is a straight "up-or-down" vote by the full House and Senate, the Governor has some options to make changes to the budget following its receipt. The Governor can use his line-item veto power to strike items from the budget, although courts have held that a Governor's ability to veto selection portions of an item, rather than the entire item, are limited. He can also ask the General Assembly to amend items included the budget. He also has power in deciding whether or not to sign bills that impact but are not part of the appropriations bill. He can, for example, decline to sign related bills sent to his desk by the legislators that would affect revenues or spending. The Governor could also call a special session and require lawmakers to return to Richmond to decide on the arena deal, although he cannot compel them to act. In one such recent example of that, a former Governor called the General Assembly into special session for action on gun safety, only to have the House adjourn hours after the special session convened. Youngkin has signaled that Democrats playing hardball with the arena could imperil some of their legislative priorities this session, which came as no surprise to anyone. Regardless of how details play out in the coming days, lawmakers will return to Richmond on April 17 for the scheduled Reconvened Session where they will consider any bills the Governor vetoes or amendments including their budget proposal.

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Virginia First Cities Updates

In the housing arena, the governor signed the Virginia Housing Commission-recommended HB 477 (Del. Coyner) and SB 50 (Sen. Locke) that extends the expiration of the Eviction Diversion Pilot Program to July 1, 2025. Currently, the Program is set to expire on July 1, 2024.

Also in the housing sector, the Governor made recommendations to HB 597, a bill to give localities some teeth to enforce a landlord's duty to maintain a rental dwelling unit. The Governor recommendations include that the bill be reenacted by the 2025 General Assembly and that the Department of Housing and Community Development (the Department) submit a report by December 1, 2024, to the Chairmen of the House Committee on General Laws and the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology detailing all amendments made to the Virginia Residential Landlord and Tenant Act within the past five years and the effects such amendments have had on the cost, accessibility, and availability of rental dwelling units in the



Commonwealth. DHCD must also provide in its report an analysis of whether such amendments have facilitated or hindered the Commonwealth's efforts to address statewide housing needs. Nothing in the governor's recommendations about a balance between the health and safety issues suffered by renters in persistently cited substandard housing.

The waning days of the 2024 Session saw high profile bills emerge from committees of conference that we know are of interest to our members. Among those that passed and are on their way to the Governor:

Recreational Retail Sales of Marijuana

Intended to build a fair retail market that gives big cannabis companies, small entrepreneurs, farmers and communities most impacted by the war on drugs a chance at new business opportunities, the bill sets May 1, 2025 as the start date for recreational marijuana sales (dispensary applications would start in September 2024). The market would be overseen by the Cannabis Control Authority.

The bill would impose an eight percent tax, in addition to a 1.125 percent sales tax, that would apply on any retail marijuana, retail marijuana products, marijuana paraphernalia sold by a retail store, as well as non-retail marijuana and non-retail marijuana products.

The bill would further provide that any locality may, by ordinance, impose an additional tax on these retail and non-retail products at a rate not to exceed 2.5 percent that would apply in addition to local food and beverage and meals taxes. The taxes imposed would be collected by the seller and remitted to the CCA. Any local tax revenue would be returned to the locality in which it was collected.

If signed, the bill would become effective July 1, 2024. The CCA would be authorized to begin accepting license applications, including those from pharmaceutical processors, September 1, 2024. Several provisions of the bill related to the recreational marijuana market would become effective May 1, 2025. The provision of this bill authorizing income tax deductions would be effective for taxable years beginning on and after January 1, 2024.

Perhaps signaling his displeasure at no dealing on the Alexandria arena, Governor Youngkin vetoed Senate Finance Chair Lucas' bill that would specify that simply possessing or consuming legal marijuana products no longer counts as abuse or neglect for the purposes of child custody and visitation. Perhaps a harbinger of what is to come on the retail marijuana sales bill?

Skill Games

Sen. Aaron Rouse's (and Delegate Cliff Hayes') bill passed and is on its way to the Governor. Passing with bipartisan support, the bill establishes the Virginia Small Business Economic Development Act for the purpose of providing a regulatory and registration structure for skill game machines in the Commonwealth. No clue as yet as to how the Governor will receive the legislation. Here are the details of the bill that is on its way to his desk:



The bill establishes that skill game machines operated pursuant to the proposal are not illegal gambling.

Responsibility for regulating skill games machines with the Virginia Lottery Board. However, enactment clauses require the Board to adopt regulations necessary to implement the Act by January 1, 2027, and establish that until that time, the provisions will be implemented by the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority (ABC).

The bill requires the Lottery Board to adopt regulations to establish a voluntary exclusion program where any person who participates agrees to refrain from certain betting or gaming activities. The bill requires that any state agency must assist in administering the voluntary exclusion program at the request of the Department of Taxation.

The bill sets limits on the number of skill game machines at four in any ABC retail licensee and at ten at any truck stop establishment. The bill prohibits anyone younger than 21 from operating a skill game machine.

The bill establishes the Virginia Small Business Economic Development Fund, which is a non-reverting fund, generated from fees, charges, and civil penalties authorized by this legislation, that must be used solely for the purposes of financing the administration and operation of skill game machines oversight.

The bill establishes the PreK-12 Priority Fund, which would receive receipts generated by the bill and must be used solely for public education purposes in the Commonwealth in accordance with the general appropriation act. The bill requires distributors to remit a monthly tax equal to 25 percent of gross receipts and allocates the distribution of the revenue:

- 25 percent of the gross revenue for each skill game machine that such distributor provided for play during the previous month.
- -Two percent to the Problem Gambling Treatment and Support Fund, established pursuant to § 37.2-314.2;
- -Six percent to the Department of Taxation to cover the costs incurred in administering the provisions of this section and, of the amounts remaining after such allocation to the Department, to the Lottery Board for the purposes of implementing this chapter;
- -Fifteen percent to the Department for distribution to localities in which the skill game machines are located;
- -One percent to the law-enforcement agencies that have primary law-enforcement responsibilities in any locality in which skill game machines are located;



-One percent to the Department of State Police to be used by the Office of the Gaming Enforcement Coordinator, established pursuant to § 52-54; and

-Seventy-five percent to the PreK-12 Priority Fund established pursuant to § 58.1-4207.

We will have to see what lens the Governor will look through when deciding what to do with the skill games legislation.

Inclusionary Zoning Bill

Of continued interest to VFC, particularly the VFC Housing Access Work Group, Senator Jeremy McPike's SB 597 passed the House and Senate and is on its way to the Governor. The as-passed legislation would let any Virginia locality expand and enact affordable housing programs such as offering developers increased density and mixed-use designations or financial incentives in exchange for developments including below-market-rate housing options. Currently, only Albemarle, Arlington, and Loudoun counties, along with the cities of Alexandria and Charlottesville, have these abilities. SB 597 hits a couple of buttons for VFC: 1) it would end the so-called Christmas tree effect and allow local governments to adopt an ordinance OR NOT if they find (after citizen engagement and comments) that it would be helpful to the locality in terms of helping to expand affordable housing and 2) it recognizes that there is not a one-size fits all for our VFC member localities, let along the rest of the Commonwealth localities. SB 597 provides an option. There is concern that the governor may impose the same treatment on SB 597 as he did on HB 597 (mentioned above) — That is, put a reenactment clause on the legislation and ask the Virginia DHCD to justify all the regulatory reasons why it is difficult to build more housing. SB 597 checks many of the boxes the governor purports to want to have happen to provision more affordable and workforce housing.

K-12 Report

As is always the case, those of us who work in K-12 have to await the final budget to determine action on many of the items that will have the biggest impacts on funding levels, staffing requirements, and policy changes for our public schools. That report was made public late on Thursday afternoon. Rules require that the budget conference report must be public for 48 hours before the General Assembly can vote to adopt, so late in the afternoon on Saturday, the House and Senate each adopted the report with bi-partisan support and then adjourned sine die. There are details on the key K-12 budget drivers below, but the adopted budget significantly increases state funding for our public schools over the Governor's introduced budget. The action was possible because the budget conferees rejected the Governor's tax income tax cut proposal and some of his tax increases. They did adopt one of the Governor's tax increase proposals, but overall, the policy decisions made in the budget left the conferees with more than \$2 billion over the introduced budget to spend.

As we reported, even before the budget conference report was made available publicly, Governor Youngkin held a press conference criticizing the budget and the decisions made by the Democrat majorities in the House and Senate. After the budget was adopted and the legislature adjourned sine die, the Governor criticized the tax increases in the budget as "backwards" and seemed to



indicate he may veto the budget and force the General Assembly to start over. We will have to see how the budget plays out over the next six weeks until the General Assembly reconvenes on April 17, but, for now, the budget adopted on Saturday is good for K-12. More details below, but first some key bills we tracked all session also had final action. Please review the full bill list to see all of the legislation that passed the General Assembly and is headed to the Governor's desk.

HB398 (McQuinn)/SB586 (Pekarsky)- These are the school discipline bills focused on the implementation of restorative justice practices before students could be suspended or expelled. As these bills worked their way through the committee process, they were each amended and reamended at times being permissive with "school boards shall consider" to mandates with "school boards shall". In the end, the conference report on these bills requires that no student can be suspended or expelled without the school board considering a restorative justice practice. The conference report also includes a requirement that school divisions report the use of these practices to the VDOE annually.

SB142 (Ruff/Mulchi)- This bill, championed by the Virginia Association of School Superintendents (VASS), provides for locally awarded teaching licenses. In its final form, the bill will require the VA Board of Education to award this license at the request of a school superintendent. This new category of license is intended to be a pathway towards either a provisional or full teaching license for a candidate who is not currently eligible for either. The intention is that this locally awarded license be used only for those teachers a school superintendent or school board wishes to hire, but who does not meet the eligibility requirements for a provisional or professional license. VASS testified that this legislation was needed to give them more flexibility to hire teachers to address the shortage. This bill is likely to be signed by the Governor which will make it effective for the 2024-2025 school year.

SB433 (Sutterlein)- Legislation related to SLIFE students (Students with Limited or Interrupted Formal Education) has been filed for the last few sessions. SLIFE students are usually new to the U.S. school system and have had interrupted or limited schooling opportunities in their native country. They have limited backgrounds in reading and writing in their native language(s) and are oftentimes, below grade level in most academic areas. The intention of this and previous legislation has been to determine how to account for students with this kind of background in determining high school graduation rates especially if they enroll in the school division nearing the age of graduation. This bill requires the VA Board of Education to develop and adopt policies relating to supporting SLIFE students in staying in and graduating from high school and to develop formulas for calculating high school drop-out rates and graduation rates that consider the limited formal education these students may have had.

HB269 (McQuinn)- This bill addresses the loophole in the career switcher program related to special education teachers. Currently the career switcher program established by the VDOE does not allow for anyone who is interested in earning a license to teach special education to use this pathway. HB269 requires the VA BOE to change that policy. The intention here to is to open up as may pathways as possible for earning a teaching license especially on one of the hardest to staff areas.



HB805 (Rasoul)/SB14 (McPike)- These are the bills that will allow any locality in Virginia to hold a referendum to increase the local sales tax by up to 1% to support school construction. Current law gives that authority to only 7 localities. The bills passed with significant bipartisan support, but we expect this bill to get caught up in the Governor's budget action related to tax increases. Even though this legislation does not raise taxes, it simply allows a locality to ask their voters if they are willing to pay more taxes to support school construction, there is a growing concern that the Governor may veto this legislation. Local government and school boards are working hard to compel the Governor to sign the bill. We will need to track this one closely.

HB1089 (Coyner)/SB220 (Favola)- These bills address special education services in our public schools. In their final form, the bills require significant new parent and family support for students with IEPs to include the establishment and staffing of regional parent resource centers. Additionally, the legislation requires the Commission on Youth to address the issues VA faces related to IEP dispute claims. The bill also establishes a large wide-ranging work group to advise the VDOE on special education services and delivery and requires colleges of teacher preparation to add special education course content and field experiences for all teacher candidates, not just those seeking a license in special ed. For school divisions the main implication of the legislation is related to professional development for all teachers. Since 70% of Virginia's students with IEPs are served in general education classrooms, the bill requires PD for all. It is expected that this rollout will follow the model implemented related to the Literacy Act with targeted PD delivered to certain staff over the course of a few years.

HB1451 (Phillips) is the SOL expedited retake bill. After sailing through the House, the bill picked up some heat in the Senate and seemed destined to fail. In fact, the bill did narrowly fail on Monday until the Senate voted to take the bill by for the day and reconsider it later in the week. The bill, in its original form, would codify the opportunity for students to be offered a retake of nearly any state assessment if they narrowly failed the original test. Currently that opportunity is only granted through VA BOE regulations without any requirement that they be available. There is real fear that as the VA BOE makes significant changes to school accreditation and test cut scores that they would also disallow any test retakes. This legislation was designed to ensure that wouldn't happen. In the end there was a compromise that doesn't codify the right to a retake but requires the VA BOE to establish the right of any student to be offered a retake. Members of the Senate who were working on this bill behind the scenes give all the credit to school superintendents and school boards who reached out to their member of the Senate asking them to support the bill. In the end the bill had overwhelming support in the House and Senate and is headed to the Governor's desk where will not be surprised to see him offer recommendations on the bill to give more flexibility to the VA BOE to eliminate retakes. This will be a bill to follow in the lead up to Reconvene Session on April 17.

HB1477 (Rasoul) addresses an issue we have been hearing for a few years, that, because of "seat time requirements" schools have little flexibility to offer innovative approaches to instruction. HB1477 requires the VA BOE to update their regulations on seat time to offer the broadest flexibility possible to schools. The regulations on seat time have not been updated since 2015



and much has changed since that time. We know the VA BOE is eager to get to work on these new regs, and we will need to track this work closely.

<u>HB599</u> (Simonds)- Permits any school board, in concurrence of their local governing body, to establish a capital reserve fund as a savings account into which it exclusively deposits the local operating funds that remain unexpended at the end of the year. These funds would be used only for future school division capital expenditures.

HB1076 (Rasoul)/SB435 (Sutterlein) grants school divisions flexibility on providing options on the through-year growth assessments they are currently required to provide. This flexibility is intended to offer relief from the overuse of SOL tests as a way to measure growth. As the VDOE looks for and rolls out a new, more robust state assessment system, this legislation gives schools flexibility to use a locally created alternative assessment for the next two school years (SY24-25 and 25-26). The hope is that by the time this flexibility expires, the new state assessment system will be available.

Training and Curriculum Bills- The other big category of bills we reported this session related to training (student and staff) and new curriculum requirements that were, in general, health and safety related. Legislation to train students and/or staff on the recognition of an allergic reaction, on the administration of Narcan, on hazing and bullying, on fentanyl, on menstruation, on the environment, and on composting, just to name a few, all came as bills this session. Each of these items is important and are designed to make sure schools are safe and welcoming, but when you see this many in one session, there is concern about how to implement these plans while also ensuring core instruction happens. In general, we have been able to minimize the impact on time of many of these mandates, but moving forward the legislature will need to figure out ow to balance the need for this type of training with providing student instruction and support in the core content areas.

Joint Committee to Evaluate the JLARC Report on K-12 Funding Formulas- Now that the General Assembly has adjourned, we expect the work of this joint committee to begin. The legislators appointed to this committee will review and evaluate all of the recommendations from the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission's (JLARC) Report on Virginia's K-12 Funding Formulas. While some legislation to address the JLARC recommendations did pass this session, in general it will be the work of the Joint Committee to develop a plan for the implementation of the other recommendations. They will work during the off-session and report back to the full General Assembly by November 1, 2024, ahead of the 2025 General Assembly session. Tracking this joint committee will be a large part of our work over the next months.

Budget Conference Report and Key Budget Action

As mentioned above, the House Appropriations Committee and the Senate Finance and Appropriations Committees released a summary of all the key budget actions taken by the budget conferees soon after their released the budget. You can see that document in full here. Please take special note in the summary of the significant action the budget conferees took related to Early Childhood Education and the Childcare Subsidy Grant Program. While we do not report on those



amendments in this report, important to many school systems is that the conference budget restores the Local Composite Index Cap for the Virginia Preschool Initiative. For many school divisions, the impacts of the elimination of the cap in the introduced budget was significant. Restoring the cap is a good new to those divisions.

In K-12 the conference budget provides a total of \$2.5 billion in general funds above the 2024 fiscal year base budget, which is **\$1.2 billion over the Governor's introduced budget**. Below please find a summary of some of the key provisions in the conference report.

• Rebenchmarking

This was an issue of concern in the introduced budget as the Governor included one-time funds allocated in the final 2022-2024 budget that the General Assembly adopted in September, to offset full rebenchmarking costs. The conference budget reverses that action and provides \$969 million for the full cost of rebenchmarking without supplanting those funds with one-time money.

• Grocery Tax Hold Harmless

A portion of all state sales tax collected is allocated to K-12 to reduce the overall state costs and local share of providing our system of public schools. When the General Assembly passed legislation eliminating the state sales tax on groceries, they included language it the bill to provide for supplemental payments to school divisions to cover the loss of these state revenues. The Governor's introduced budget eliminated the language in that section of the Code and eliminated the associated funding which resulted in an estimated cut to K-12 of \$230 million over the biennium. The conference budget restores the supplemental payment and includes an additional distribution of over \$168 million related to the expansion of the sales tax base to include "New Economy" digital products and services.

• Budget Strips Two Priorities of Governor Youngkin

- O Diploma Plus Voucher Program- The conference budget redirects the \$40 million in funding (\$20M FY25/\$20M FY26) that was included in the introduced budget to fund the newly created "Diploma Plus Program". That program was established to support students who wanted to earn an industry credential but was funded through a voucher system.
- Lab Schools- The conference budget also eliminates the \$60 million investment the introduced budget made in the Governor's Lab School Fund. The amendment also maintains language that limits the use of the Fund to public four-year institutions which had been reversed in the Governor's budget. While the new funding for Lab Schools was removed from the biennial budget, the conference report does maintain the amount allocated in previous budget action in the Fund for use throughout the 2024-26 biennium.



• Compensation Supplements

The conference budget reallocates the funds provided in FY25 for the 1% bonus and in FY25 for a 2% salary increase towards a 3% salary increase in both years. In FY24 just over \$178 million is provided and in FY26 \$361 million is provided to cover the state share of a 3% salary increase for all SOQ funded instructional and support positions. Both of the increases are for a full year (July 1). The state share of funding provided to a school division will be prorated for school divisions that provide less than an average 3.0 percent salary increase the first year; however, to access these funds, a school division must provide at least an average 1.5 percent salary increase in both years. School divisions that provided an average increase in excess of 3.0 percent in the first year may credit the excess portion of the increase toward the second year for the purpose of accessing these funds in the second year.

Additional Funding to Support Implementation of the VA Literacy Act

The conference budget adds an additional \$5.7 million in FY25 and \$3.7 million in FY26 from the amounts proposed in the introduced budget for implementation of the VA Literacy Act. The budget conferees allocated any remaining funds from the Governor's Learning Acceleration Grants to cover the cost of this increase. The Learning Acceleration Grants were funded through unobligated federal pandemic relief balances, and it is estimated that more than \$10M in Learning Acceleration Grants may be left unspent.

• Attendance Recovery Services

The conference budget directs the Superintendent of Public Instruction to enter into a statewide contract with a provider experienced in attendance recovery services. This is a "language only" amendment, so it seems that school divisions would need to buy off of the state contract using their own resources.

• Implementation of the Special Education Legislation (HB1089/SB220)

As mentioned above, HB1098 and SB220 make significant changes to family supports and staff professional development to improve delivery of special education services in VA. The conference budget provides \$2.2 million each year to implement the provisions of the legislation related to establishing eight regional special education family support centers, expanded professional development, and ongoing special education coaching. The amendment also directs any remaining federal pandemic relief balances from Learning Acceleration Grants be used to supplant general funds in the first year.

• Office of School Quality

The conference budget restores \$1.9 million from the general fund in each year to the Office of School Quality and establishes reporting requirements. The office was eliminated in the introduced budget.



• Community Schools

\$140,000 is provided each year each to establish an Office of Community Schools at the VDOE. Additionally, another \$2.5 million is provided each year for the Community Schools Development and Implementation Planning Grant program.

Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Exam Fee Reduction Program

The conference report establishes a program and provides associated funding to support economically disadvantaged students who wish to take the AP or IB Exam or Cambridge Assessment. The program will provide funding for all but the last \$20 of the cost of the exam for any public high school student who is eligible to receive free or reduced price lunch after all other applicable discounts and financial assistance are considered. For students attending a school participating in the Community Eligibility Provision, eligibility shall be based on an individual student's family income.

• 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program

This item provides \$3.0 million in FY25 and \$2.0 million in FY26 to supplement the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program. These funds shall be awarded to community-based organizations partnering with school divisions for afterschool, before-school, and summer learning programs to provide additional instructional opportunities to combat learning loss for school-age children attending high-poverty, low-performing schools. The Department may contract with the Virginia Partnership for Out-of-School Time to assist applicants with obtaining the required licensure and to provide best practices and support to grantees.

Additional Funding for Title 1 National Board Certified Teachers

This item adds \$500,000 each year for incentive grants for teachers who are pursuing or have obtained a national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and work in a Title 1 school or a school eligible for participation in the Community Eligibility Provision.

At Risk Add-On Program

The conference report partially implements the JLARC recommendations related to the At Risk Add-On program. This item provides \$186.7 million in FY25 and \$184.6 million in FY26 to consolidate the SOQ Prevention, Intervention, and Remediation and At Risk Add-On incentive funding into a single At-Risk Add-On funding program. Additionally, the budget transitions the formula used to calculate the number of At-Risk students from federal free lunch rates to federal identified Student Percentage rates as recommended by JLARC. Further the budget adds multiplier to this calculation based on additional factors including the number of English learner students. The budget also funds a distribution of an 11.0 percent add on to basic aid funding per at-risk student and increases the variable add on to between 0 and 37%, up from 0 to 36% in the introduced budget. The variable add on is determined by the concertation of At-Risk students in a school division relative



to all other school divisions. This changes address in part recommendations 8, 9, and 10 from the JLARC report.

• English Learner (EL) Staffing Ratios

The budget conferees struck some balance between the JLARC recommendations and the different approaches taken on this issue in the House and Senate budget proposals. The conference budget does establish staffing ratios based on student proficiency levels, but amends the numbers recommended by JLARC to address the concerns many school divisions raised about the need to hire significant numbers of new EL teachers to meet the JLARC (and House) ratios.

The conference budget provides \$37.9 million in FY25 and \$43.7 million in FY26 to implement staffing standards for English Learner students based on student <u>proficiency level</u>, in lieu of the current standard which is one position per 50 identified EL students. Flexibility is provided during the first year to implement this new standard to only require one-half of the additional positions.

- o EL Student Proficiency Level SOQ Staffing Required
 - Level One: 1 position per 20 EL students
 - Level Two: 1 position per 30 EL students
 - Level Three: 1 position per 40 EL students
 - Level Four: 1 position per 50 EL students
 - All Other Identified EL Students 1 position per 100 EL Students

• Increase Reimbursements for School Breakfast Programs

The conference budget provides an additional \$2.4 million in FY25 and \$2.7 million in FY26 to increase the per meal reimbursement amount from \$0.22 to \$0.28 for the state funded incentive program to maximize federal school nutrition revenues and increase participation in the school breakfast program.

• School Construction Loans

The budget authorizes the Department of Education to offer \$250.0 million in school construction loans from the Literary Fund over the biennium and directs the Board of Education to revise its schedule of interest rates to be fully responsive to market rates while providing reasonably discounted interest rates.

• Decreased Rate- Group Life Insurance

The VRS Board reduced the actuarial rate for group life insurance from 1.34% to 1.18% and the reduction in state funding of \$3 million in FY25 and \$3.1 million in FY26 reflects this change.
