Participatory Budgeting Steering Commission

Vacancies as of August 11, 2024

The Commission shall be composed of **seven members** and **four non-voting alternate members** appointed by the Council. All appointments shall be otherwise governed by sections 2-755 and 2-756 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended.

- (1) 2 voting members shall reside in a Council district located north of the James River;
- (2) 3 voting members shall reside in a Council district located south of the James River;
- (3) 1 voting member shall be a person with a disability;
- (4) 1 voting member shall be a resident of public housing;
- (5) 4 non-voting alternate members shall be residents of the city of Richmond and may be appointed from any Council district.

Membership of the Commission should possess experience and expertise concerning various aspects of community investment and development, public finance, urban planning, community health and wellbeing, community organization, and community outreach that may be relevant to the consideration of formulating standards and procedures for participatory budgeting.

The voting members and non-voting alternate members shall serve for terms of two years and may serve up to two consecutive terms.

In serving on the Participatory Budgeting Steering Commission, I will bring a fervent commitment to ma Richmond's participatory budgeting process as inclusionary as possible, ensuring the system builds as much consensus as possible, and that all who participate in the process feel that decisions were arrive as fairly as possible. Richmonders have great ideas on how to make our city better, and it's my goal to make sure that no Richmonder keeps those ideas to themselves because they feel like their voice won matter.
Data shows that when citizens participate in and are given direct responsibilities to their self-governme they take it very seriously and generally increase involvement in their communities afterwards. Be it this serving on a jury to determine guilt or innocence, participating in a Citizens' Assembly, or through participatory budgeting, everyday folks rise to the occasion and make decisions that have a higher level consensus than those typically made through our traditional, more politicized representative bodies.
I'm a passionate believer in the strengthening of our democratic systems and the creation of new ones—more democracy is always better than less democracy. The more people who can affect real, pot change in our self-government, the more legitimacy that self-government has. Democracy is so much in than electing representatives to office, it's everyday citizens learning about a topic, talking to each other challenging each other, and making decisions about what collective actions to take for the benefit of us We're not all always going to agree with each other on a group's ultimate decision, but it's vitally import we create structures and systems where everyday citizens can have their voices heard, feel that their is were given a fair shot, and come away feeling that any decisions made were done so fairly.
