

Because of the position of our satellite offices and staff we are visible in the communities that we would like to target. The residents know about our office and would view our information as being 'trusted" and credible.

Typically it can be hard to reach this population because they will not open the door for you. Also, we know that there is an 'invisible population" that lives in the housing projects in the Richmond area. That 'invisible population" can be family members, which increases the population in that community.

We propose to host a pizza party in each community and invite the neighborhood out to be eat and be counted. We are also proposing an activity for the kids as well. We would also make sure that our career advisers distributed information about the census to their participants.
