ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

The patron requests that legislation be drafted authorizing the City Attorney to file an appropriate petition for concurrent jurisdiction by the City's Police Department and the Virginia Commonwealth University's Police Department in the areas of the City as shown on the attached map, pursuant to Virginia Code Section 23.1-815(B)(iv).

BACKGROUND

The City's Police Department and VCU's Police Department have shared concurrent jurisdiction in the city in certain areas of the city for some 35 years. Over that period the concurrent jurisdiction has grown as the University has grown and expanded. The attached map includes the neighborhoods of Randolph and Oregon Hill. Many VCU students, faculty, and staffers are known to live in these areas. The last expansion of the concurrent jurisdiction was done in 2018. See, Ord. 2018-336.
