§ 1. That section 12-22 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2020) is hereby **amended** and reordained as follows:

Sec. 12-22. Authority to accept payment by commercially acceptable means; service charge.

(a) Pursuant to Code of Virginia, § 2.2-614.1(A), the City may accept payment of any amount due for taxes, interest, penalties, fees, fines, or other charges by any commercially acceptable means, including, but not limited to, checks, credit cards, debit cards, and electronic funds transfers.

PURPOSE:

To amend and reordain City Code § 12-22. - Authority to accept payment by commercially acceptable means; service charge to permit City agencies the option to remove currently mandated services charges for the payment of any amount due for taxes, interest, penalties, fees, fines, or other charges for the public.

BACKGROUND:

City Code § 12-22. - Authority to accept payment by commercially acceptable means; service charge. subsection (b) currently reads, "[...] the City *shall* add to any amount due a sum, not to exceed the amount charged to the City for acceptance of any payment by a means that incurs a charge to the City or the amount negotiated and agreed to in a contract with the City, whichever is less." Emphasis added on shall, as it is currently a requirement that all City agencies pass service charges to the payor.

This O&R Request is to legislatively strike the previously emphasized "shall" and replace it with a less restrictive "may". This will provide City agencies, namely the Department of Finance, selective discretion to pass on service charges to those making payments or instead pay the cost of service charges out of the General Fund. There are a wide variety of service charges, not all of which it may be ideal for the City to foot the cost for. For example, this legislative change would

allow the Department of Finance to pass through the cost of Non-Sufficient Funds (NSF) charges to taxpayers but cover the cost for flat fees for ACH processing.

Allowing City agencies to cover certain costs will potentially lead to efficiencies citywide. Under current legislative requirements for service fees many taxpayers choose to pay cash in person to avoid said fees. This creates additional staff and operational costs to process cash transactions by hand as opposed to more automated online options which streamline operations.

The Department of Finance is proposing this legislative change as a result of the Chief Administrative Officer's vision of a modernized Revenue Administration Division. As the Department of Finance monitors changes in taxpayer behavior, there may be additional funding needs in future fiscal years.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

The Department of Finance will update all online payment information to reflect changes implemented as a result in a phased approach should Council approve the proposed ordinance and additionally provide inserts to regular billings announcing the change.
