CHAMBER EMERCENCY EVACUATION PLAN AND CITIZEN SPEAKER GUIDELINES

President Chris Hilbert called the meeting to order and presided. Upon the President's request, Deputy City Clerk Candice Reid provided information on the appropriate manner in which the Council Chamber is to be evacuated in the event of an emergency along with citizen speaker guidelines.

CITIZEN COMMENT

Clovia Lawrence requested Council's support for Project Give Back to Community, which is a partnership between police and communities that promotes public safety.

Pierce Homer provided a brief history on the Westwood Tract process that has taken place to reach this point for possible development and thanked Council for approving the study of the Westwood Tract.

Hampton Carver addressed Council stating that economic development of the Westwood Tract would bring many burdens to the community.

Colby Fewster requested that Council consider erecting an arch at the intersection of Monument and Meadow Avenues as a celebration of history from 1866 to the present, and to show that Richmond is a united city.

Councilor Andreas Addison thanked Colby for sharing his dream of erecting a monument that will recognize Richmond as a united city and urged him to stay civically engaged.

Councilor Michael Jones commended Colby for his statements and stated that Colby represents the promise of Richmond.

Adam Sitterding addressed Council regarding pedestrian safety concerns if the Westwood Tract is developed and asked that Council support a transportation study of the area.

Councilor Parker Agelasto suggested that Economic and Community Development attend a future Land Use, Housing and Transportation Standing Committee meeting to provide an update on the Federal Ominbus Bill and its funding expectations for the city.

Support

Julie Anderson, on behalf of Virginia Supportive Housing, spoke in support of the proposed legislation stating that the ordinance will allow the New Clay House II to continue to provide permanent supportive housing for many years and also stated that 95% of the clients they serve do not return to a state of homelessness.

John Bolton, on behalf of better Housing Coalition, spoke in support of the proposed legislation stating that Council's support of the ordinance is greatly appreciated.

Councilor Kim Gray requested that Council support ORD. 2017-083 to move the housing projects forward.

Councilor Andreas Addison stated that the proposed ordinance provides transparency and accountability to the FY18 budget; however, the challenge is the time line to vote on the budget with an amendment being introduced to Council at the current meeting. Mr. Addison stated that he was under the impression that his consent vote at the May 3rd Budget Work Session was for the formatting change and not for the process of individuals having to appear before Council prior to making transfers within their department.

Vice President Cynthia Newbille stated that she is committed to transparency, accountability, accurate reporting and ensuring that the strategy put forth does not create consequences that negatively impact the ability of departments to function at the highest level.

Councilor Ellen Robertson stated that her vote is based on the amendment being the only option available and to protect the interest of areas that need to be funded. Councilor Robertson asked

that the Governmental Operations Standing Committee review and re-evaluate the current budget process.

Councilor Michael Jones stated that his vote is based on his trust in Council's budget staff and thanked them for their work throughout the budget process.

Councilor Kim Gray reminded Council that citizens want more accountability and transparency regarding city spending.

Councilor Kristen Larson thanked Councilor Gray for bringing the budget amendment forward, stating that the format referenced in the amendment will facilitate an ongoing discussion throughout the budget year and will prove beneficial to Council and citizens.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell stated she wants to ensure that departments' budgetary needs are being met.
