



Hurricane Season 2024 - Outlook

- Tropical Storm Alberto 17 June Texas
- Hurricane Beryl 28 June Category 4 Texas
- Tropical Storm Chris 30 June SW Gulf of Mexico




Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale

- Category 1: Winds of 74–95 mph, minimal damage to buildings, trees, and signs
- Category 2: Winds of 96–110 mph, extremely dangerous winds will cause extensive damage
- Category 3: Winds of 111–130 mph, devastating damage
- Category 4: Winds of 130–156 mph, catastrophic damage
- Category 5: Winds over 157 mph, catastrophic damage
