## EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To amend Res. No. 2018-R011, adopted Feb. 12, 2018, which approved an expenditure in the amount of \$3,000.00 from the Council District Funds for the Fourth District to pay Printersmark, Inc., for the printing and mailing of the Fourth District Winter 2018 Newsletter, to modify the amount of the authorized expenditure to \$3,029.49. (Ms. Larson)
2. To appoint Candice D. Reid to serve as City Clerk. (All Members of Council)

## MOTIONS TO AMEND

3. To amend Ord. No. 2018-031, which amends ch. 12, art. II of the City Cod by adding therein a new § 12-37, concerning the disposition of cigarette tax proceeds, and amends Chapter 26 of the City Code by adding therein a new art. XVIII, consisting of sections numbered 26-1277 through 26-1288, concerning the levy of a cigarette tax, for the purpose of imposing a new tax on the sale of cigarettes with the intent of making additional funds available for the renovation and replacement of public school facilities in the city, to modify the purposes and disposition of cigarette tax proceeds.
4. To amend Ord. No. 2018-100, which amends City Code § 12-16, concerning the provisions of monthly financial synopses to the Council, and City Code § 12-32, concerning the disposition of funds from sale of real estate and certain insurance proceeds, for the purpose of revising the basis for calculating receipts to be credited to a special reserve assigned to support public schools in the city and requiring that monthly financial synopses provided to the City Council include activities with regard both to such special reserve and to another special reserve assigned to support the educational curriculum and programming of public schools in the city, to revise the information required to be included in the monthly synopsis.

To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Right of Way Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Transportation to allow temporary access to certain portions of Little John Park located at 1401 Little John Road in the city of Richmond for the purpose of constructing improvements to State Highway Route 95 east of its intersection with Hermitage Road. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – April 17, 2018}**
