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What is a Community Health Assessment (CHA)?

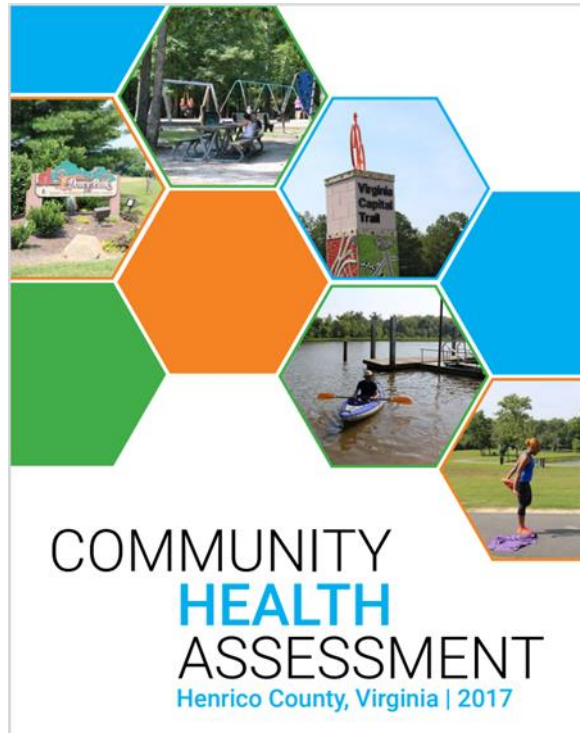
A CHA is a systematic process that identifies key health needs, issues, and assets within a given community.



What are Community Health Improvement Plans (CHIPs)?

Health improvement plans are long-term implementation strategies and efforts towards addressing the health needs of a community that have been identified during the CHA and is typically updated every 3 to 5 years.

Key Findings from Henrico's 2017 CHA:

- Changing populations creates challenges for our health system
- Higher rates of poor birth outcomes
- Obesity, inactivity, & unhealthy food options
- Mental health
- Substance use disorder
- Opportunities for partnership & collaboration
- Access to health services
- Health disparities

- Physical Activity
- Nutrition
- Access to Care
- Mental Health
- Opioid Use

Why Do We Do Them?

- Encourages community engagement
- Provides opportunities for funding
- Identifies the root cause of key health problems
- Improves the health of the community
- Share knowledge and understanding about the community
- Influences for policy change with legislators on the city, county, and state level



How Are the Results Used?

Data from the assessment informs decision-making, prioritization of health problems and the development of plans to improve the health of the community.



What is a CHA Survey?



A CHA survey is a qualitative data tool used to gather insights directly from community residents.

RHHD's 2024 CHA Survey



- Collecting responses until July 31st
- Available in English & Spanish
- Is electronic but paper copies are available in various RHHD locations
- Takes on average ~5 minutes to complete
- Goal: 1600 responses

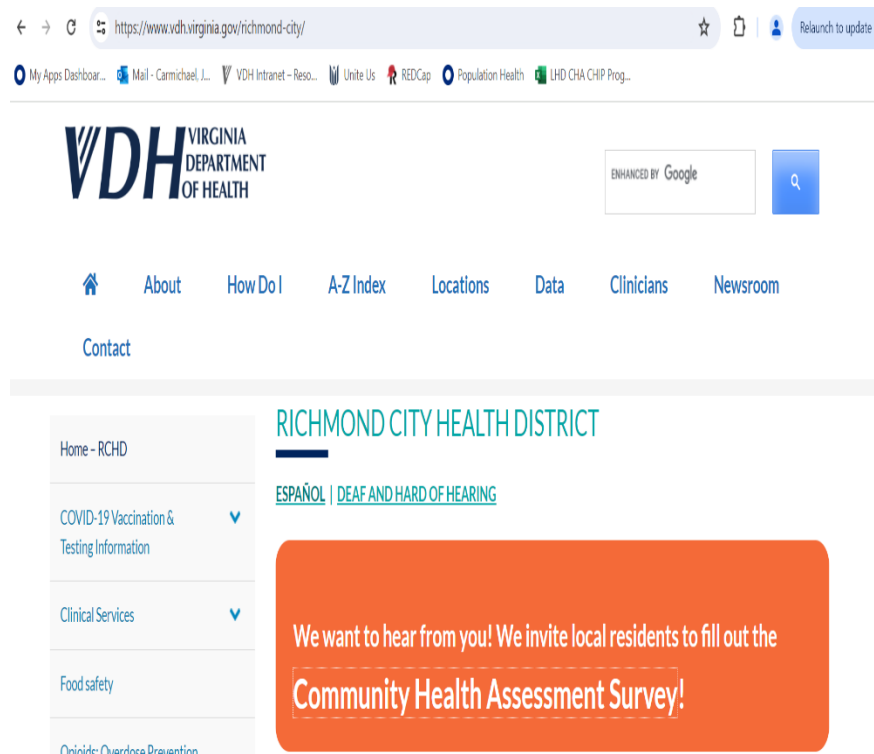
