# Minority Business Enterprise and Emerging Small Business Advisory Board

Vacancies as of August 10, 2025

The advisory board shall be composed of nine members appointed by the Council. Of the nine members, five members shall be representatives of a minority business enterprise, two members shall be representatives of lenders or businesses other than a minority business enterprise, one member shall be a Section 3 contractor representative and one member shall be either an at-large resident of the city or a member of the Council.

The Council shall nominate:

Three (3) members who shall be representatives of a minority business enterprise,

One (1) member who shall be a representative of lenders or businesses other than a minority business enterprise

One (1) member who shall be either an at-large resident of the city or a member of the Council The Mayor shall nominate:

Two (2) members who shall be representatives of a minority business enterprise, One (1) member who shall be a representative of lenders or businesses other than a minority business enterprise

One (1) member who shall be a Section 3 contractor representative

The Board may elect from its membership a chairman and other officers it deems necessary in accordance with its rules of procedure or bylaws.





# **Participatory Budgeting Steering Commission**

#### Vacancies as of August 10, 2025

The Commission shall be composed of **seven members** and **four non-voting alternate members** appointed by the Council. All appointments shall be otherwise governed by sections 2-755 and 2-756 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended.

- (1) 2 voting members shall reside in a Council district located north of the James River;
- (2) 3 voting members shall reside in a Council district located south of the James River;
- (3) 1 voting member shall be a person with a disability;
- (4) 1 voting member shall be a resident of public housing;

(5) 4 - non-voting alternate members shall be residents of the city of Richmond and may be appointed from any Council district.

Membership of the Commission should possess experience and expertise concerning various aspects of community investment and development, public finance, urban planning, community health and wellbeing, community organization, and community outreach that may be relevant to the consideration of formulating standards and procedures for participatory budgeting.

The voting members and non-voting alternate members shall serve for terms of two years and may serve up to two consecutive terms.


